Pastor's Note . . . Discipleship comes with hardships and rewards...Last Sunday we reflected on the cost of discipleship, where Jesus talks about the risks involved in bearing witness to him. And he also reminded us to keep trusting in the providential care of the Lord. Oppositions and challenges are part of the life of a faithful disciple of Jesus who is willing to act out of selflessness, like Jesus. And today Jesus further assures the disciples, who were being sent out on a mission, that their work, even if it brings with it dangers and challenges, will also bring with it rewards. Kindness will be rewarded always, because any act of kindness is an expression of God's way of reaching out to people. The first reading gives a demonstration of this, where the woman, who was kind and generous to Prophet Elisha, receives a blessing as a reward for her goodness. It is also important to note that the woman herself did not ask for a favor. Her act of kindness serves as a means for her being rewarded. And the second reading puts this in a more theological way. By virtue of our commitment to Jesus, we will have to experience the death he himself experienced. But that is not the full picture. We will also rise with him, if we belong to him and live the commitment to his message, with courage and conviction. And the Gospel reminds of the need to be courageous, because there will be risks involved in bearing witness to Christ. When we stand up for love, peace and justice, we will necessarily face challenges, but there will also be rewards. The Cross is part of the life of a faithful Christian, but the reward for them will be the life that we receive as a result of this.
