#### Always willing to do the right thing....

The season of Lent is a time for renewal and return. It is a time to renew our commitment to God and make every effort to do the right thing. Doing the right thing is often challenging, as we find a lot of things very attractive and the desire to go after them, very forceful. This is what is portrayed in both the first reading and the Gospel. Adam and Eve chose to disobey the command of God, because the thing they were asked to abstain from, looked very attractive. And this desire to go after the attractive thing made them forget the warning God had given them, and they end up doing the wrong thing. It is the same tactic the devil is using to entice Jesus in choosing to do things that would be against his commitment to God. A lot is promised, if only Jesus would put his interests before his faithfulness to God. Jesus is able to take control of the situation, because he is deeply committed to God and this commitment is deepened by his prayer life. Lent is a time for us to acquire this mentality of Jesus, where we will focus on doing the right thing, rather than do what is more convenient and attractive. When we do that, we will again live as true children of God.
