Pastor's Note: Living simple lives focused on love....Because All Saints Day falls on a Sunday this year, we take a break from the Ordinary time Sunday Readings, and focus on those who lived by the call of Jesus to live meaningful lives. We celebrate all the Saints. Some we are familiar with, but most of them we may not even have heard of. It is this very reality of living obscure lives, never wanting to or trying to come into the lime light that has made their lives worth celebrating. Some of the saints were stalwarts in their field of expertise. They led from the front, they confronted the challengers with courage, and they courageously stood before their executioners, often uttering the names of their leader until the moment of execution. These saints, who shed their blood for the sake of their faith and values are hailed as Martyrs. And we have multitude of some courageous men and women. Then there were those who went about doing simple acts of kindness never expecting anything in return. They never owned property, never even sought to possess wealth, whatever little possession they had, they used it for the wellbeing of those they served. There were people who were born of royal heritage, there were those who came from humble circumstances. Whatever their background, by the time they face the Lord, they were rich in their heart, carrying with them, riches that never perish. They differed a lot in the way they lived their lives, the language they spoke, the race they belonged, the food they consumed, the manner in which they dressed. And yet there was one thing they all possessed in common. They all were led by the values of Christ. In a world where greatness was measured by the amount of wealth one possessed, these men and women realized that what matters most is the love with which they do things in this world. They were led by love, justice and peace, which they carried with them, as a result of their deep faith in God and their commitment to the teachings of Jesus. They always gave their lives in service, they were not counted great by human standard, but always was counted as great by the one who gave himself completely. Today we hail them, even as we aspire to emulate them.
