Pastor's Note: Being ready for the Lord always...

As we approach the end of the Liturgical year, we are also made aware of the need to be prepared and be ready to welcome the Lord. There was a great expectation that Jesus would return immediately to restore the world, among the disciples. It is this expectation that gets reflected in the Gospel passage today, and the second reading. Be prepared, we do not know when the Lord would arrive. Having instructed the disciples and all his followers about the values of the Kingdom, and the ways in which we are to live in this world, Jesus is asking them to be prepared. He asked them to store up treasures that will last, which nothing can destroy. It is this treasure that we each are told to have that gets represented in the flasks of oil that the wise virgins carried with them. The first reading talks about the need to seek wisdom with genuine desire. In the Bible Wisdom represents the Lord. We are called to desire for the Lord and constantly seek his ways, so that we will truly belong to him. This desire for the Lord has to be a deep thirst for him, as the Responsorial Psalm says. And once we desire him and thirst for him, we will also be prepared to welcome the Lord. Being prepared for the Lord means that we will be wise in our decision making. This wisdom will enable us to wait with patience, even as we do what we are called to do. As Jesus instructed us, we will be like trees that produce good fruits. And when we are called to meet the Lord, we will not be found wanting in the virtues that we are called to have. So the invitation is to be always ready for the Lord, by becoming true disciples of Jesus.
