HAVE A LAUGH... A guy named Joe finds himself in dire trouble. His business has gone bust and he's in serious financial trouble. He's so desperate that he decides to ask God for help.

He begins to pray... "God, please help me. I've lost my business and if I don't get some money, I'm going to lose my house as well. Please let me win the lotto."

Lotto night comes and somebody else wins it.

Joe again prays... "God, please let me win the lotto! I've lost my business, my house and I'm going to lose my car as well".

Lotto night comes and Joe still has no luck.

Once again, he prays... "My God, why have you forsaken me?? I've lost my business, my house, and my car. My wife and children are starving. I don't often ask you for help and I have always been a good servant to you. PLEASE just let me win the lotto this one time so I can get my life back in order."

Suddenly there is a blinding flash of light as the heavens open and Joe is confronted by the voice of God Himself:

"Joe, meet Me halfway on this. Buy a ticket."

Pastor's Note: Being accountable for what is received....Jesus uses yet another parable about the vineyard, to drive home a very important point about discipleship. We have to be accountable to God at the end of the day. We are entrusted with the responsibility of caring for the vineyard and what is due to God, has to be returned to him. We cannot act out of selfishness and selfcenteredness when it comes to living as true disciples of Jesus. As the parable says in its introduction, the landlord works hard to prepare the land and to plant the vines. This is a labor of love for him. And having done this work of creation, he then entrusts it to the tenants. This again is an act of trust. And since the landlord in this parable represents God, we have to realize that the real labor of love, God engaged in, is the act of creating each human being. It is with tremendous love that God created us. And then he cared for us. Then as a faithful person, he placed his trust in each human person, to bring out good fruits. What we owe God, as his creations, is faithfulness to his ways. We have to be rooted in truth and love and bring forth good deeds, that are worthy of God. It is the frustration that God goes through when he finds his people do not live up to his expectation that we find expressed in the First Reading of today. "What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done?" This frustration of God, in reference to the people of Israel shows his concern for them. He was always there for them, always came to their rescue, because he loved them tenderly. However, they did not pay back in the same token. They turned away from him and from his ways. It is the same lament God would be expressing, when we realize that we are his vineyard today. And yet all is not lost, as the second reading tells us. If we are willing to walk in his ways, by being faithful to truth, love and justice, the God of peace will be with us. We were created with tremendous love, and we have to be grateful for this love by living as worthy children of God. Because we have received a lot from God, we have to be always accountable for them.
