#### **HAVE A LAUGH . . . Losing His Memory**

The man looked a little worried when the doctor came in to administer his annual physical, so the first thing the doctor did was to ask whether anything was troubling him.

"Well, to tell the truth, Doc, yes," answered the patient.

"You see, I seem to be getting forgetful. No, it's actually worse than that. I'm never sure I can remember where I put the car, or whether I answered a letter, or where I'm going, or what it is I'm going to do once I get there -- if I get there. So, I really need your help. What can I do?"

The doctor mused for a moment, then answered in his kindest tones, "Pay me in advance."

**Pastor's Note: No compromise on forgiveness...** Jesus continues to challenge us to be willing to forgive, not just once, but over and over again. There is no compromise for Jesus, when it comes to forgiving. This is not because he does not bother about the offenses of people. The reason for Jesus insisting on forgiveness is because he believes in the inherent goodness of people. That we are created in the image and likeness of God is not just a concept, but a reality. And since we are in the likeness of God, our nature is rooted in goodness. And even when we do wrong and stray away from God and his ways, we can still come back to him, when we rely on the grace that is at work in us. And it is no surprise that our return to God will always be celebrated with great fanfare. Repentance is a gift that is placed at the doorsteps of each person. One only has to open and use that gift. And because we are gifted with the ability to repent, we are also assured of the forgiveness that God will grant us, when we return to him. Forgiveness is the visible expression of God's love for us. He never gives up on us. He is that prodigal Father, who is awaiting our return. To be a true child of God is to be like him. Forgiveness is a necessary precondition for us to experience his love. However, Jesus insists on the fact that we have to be always willing to forgive, if we are to receive forgiveness from God. It is this theme that the first reading, from the Book of Sirach, underlines. We have to forgive, if we are to receive it from God. St. Paul reminds us that we are God's children. And Jesus paid a price in order to redeem us and to make us his own. Therefore we have to live lives worthy of him. This means that the generosity with which Jesus gave his life for us has to be acknowledged by each of us who belong to him, by becoming people who are willing to forgive. We cannot have double standards when it comes to forgiveness. If we expect God to forgive our many sins, then we also should be willing to forgive those who sin against us. Passing on forgiveness is a sure sign that we ourselves have experienced, and are transformed by the forgiveness of God toward us. There is no compromise, we have to forgive.
