# Pastor's Note: Generous beyond measure...

Having challenged us to forgive innumerable times, Jesus now goes on to show the generosity with which the Lord deals with us. This is in view of challenging us to be more like the Lord. The generosity of the Lord springs from his understanding and compassionate heart. He is near to all who call upon him, is what the Responsorial Psalm says. He sees the plight of everyone and is always willing to reach out to them, in a magnanimous way. The First Reading tells us that the thoughts of the Lord are not our thoughts. He goes beyond all human expectations and norms. It might even create jealousy in people. St. Paul asks us to conduct ourselves in a way that is worthy of the Lord. How are we to conduct ourselves, so that we will be worthy of the Lord? This is where the Parable of Jesus in today's Gospel comes to our aid. The Parable shatters all perceived understandings of the concept of justice. The landowner in today's Parable seems to act unjustly, when he treats the ones who worked only for an hour with those who worked the whole day. And yet he has a point. The ones who are hired at the last hour are treated with respect and an understanding that springs from true compassion. The landowner knows that the needs of the ones who were hired at last, is the same as that of the ones who were hired early. And he meets their need. Only a generous person can give without measure, and we are called to be like the Lord, generous beyond measure.
