HAVE A LAUGH . . . Between The Pages

A little boy opened the big and old family Bible with fascination, and looked at the old pages as he turned them. Suddenly, something fell out of the Bible, and he picked it up and looked at it closely. It was an old leaf from a tree that had been pressed in between the pages.

"Momma, look what I found," the boy called out.

"What have you got there, dear?" his mother asked.

With astonishment in the young boy's voice, he answered: "I think it's Adam's suit!"

Pastor's Note: A life graced by love.... There are many places in the Gospel where we can very vividly notice the intervention of Jesus, to heal, to calm, to rectify or even to warn. There are other situations where we see Jesus expresses a very subtle side of himself. Even in such moments what comes to fore is the deep love with which Jesus responds to a situation. In today's Gospel passage we have a manifestation of such a subtle response by Jesus, in the form of an advice. Jesus wants to drive home the fact that we all have a responsibility for the wellbeing of our brothers and sisters. It is important to help others navigate the path of righteousness, when they stray away from that path. However, this concern and the attempts to correct them, should be rooted in love and graced by love. The wellbeing of the other person should always be the responsibility of each of us, because it is for the betterment of that person. This also means that the person we want to correct himself or herself should be told so with love. And this is because, as St. Paul says in the second reading, love is the fulfilment of the law. Every law has to be rooted in love. The laws that are not rooted in love have no purpose in the life of a society. Jesus demonstrates this with his periodic disregard for the way laws were very narrowly interpreted and implemented in the Jewish religious circles. That is why Jesus was often accused of breaking the Law. Since Jesus acted with love in all situations, he gave prime importance to the wellbeing of others, even if it meant showing disregard for the interpretations of certain laws. It is important to help others be better human beings, when they choose to do things that are wrong. Sometimes certain acts are the result of a lack of awareness. It is in such situations that we should personally intervene and help the person understand and correct the mistake. Sometimes we might be misunderstanding the situation and activities of others. Here we need to go to a third party to help us sort out things with the other. When this is done with love, we are actually gathering in the name of Jesus, for love is the hallmark of Jesus's life. Our lives have to be graced by love, always.
