HAVE A LAUGH . . .

The church was conducting its annual fund drive. One member of the congregation said, "I give ten dollars." Just then, a piece of plaster fell from the ceiling and landed on his head. He spoke up again quickly. "I give a thousand dollars!" The minister said, "Lord, hit him again!" Pastor's Note: Committed to God always... While it is always challenging to be faithful to God and his commands, as we heard from the readings of last Sunday, when we are faithful to God, it is always rewarding in the end. All the Readings talk about faithfulness to the commands of God, or, in other words, being dedicated to doing God's will. It is this 'doing God's will' part that can have varied understanding in the lives of the faithful. Faithfulness to God is not about doing certain things for the sake of doing it, but making a radical change in our lives, so that whatever we do and say will be a reflection of our rootedness in God. This is more than mere obedience to the Law. Jesus was constantly criticized for his style of practicing the religion. While the Pharisees and Scribes had a way of practicing the Religion, Jesus differed from them in his understanding and obedience to the Law. As we would hear from the first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy, the instruction given by Moses to the people of Israel was that they be faithful to God's Commands. Most people practiced their religion out of fear for being punished and, thus, they lived with constant fear and guilt. However, what Moses told them was that, their faithfulness to the commands of the Lord, will make known to the world that their God is someone who comes to their aid when they are in need. In other words, their faithfulness to God and his commands should make them reflect the qualities of the God they believe in. It was, therefore, to live in faithfulness and love that God gave them the Law. Jesus has this same understanding of the Law and faithfulness to God. He always insists that a mere external practice of the Law will not be enough, there has to be a radical commitment to God's ways, which is always rooted in love, truth and justice. If we do not practice the mercy of God in our lives and are not led by love, the mere external practice of religion is meaningless. As St. James rightly points out, we have to be doers of the word, not just hearers only. Faithfulness to God is always about being guided by love, as Jesus was.
