Pastor's Note: A call to live in love...

Today we have a continuation of the Bread of life discourse in the Gospel according to John, which Jesus initiated in the Gospel passage, we heard last week. As the Jewish people find it difficult to understand what Jesus is trying to communicate, they find fault with him and they ridicule him as someone who is too ordinary. They are focused on his family, while Jesus tries to elevate the discourse to reflect on belonging to God and doing God's work. Faith in Jesus is about a transformation that one goes through, whereby one is able to live a life rooted in love and grounded in God. It is this new life St. Paul is talking about in the second reading of today. He urges us to be imitators of God, by living in love. Jesus always talked about leading us into eternal life, and the focus of the conversation today is rooted in that very concern Jesus has for his followers. Our life goes beyond this world, and if we require material food to sustain us for our existence in this world, we require spiritual sustenance to move on to the next. Jesus is that spiritual food we are fed with. To be in Christ is to be about a person committed to love. When Elijah was tired after the long journey and spiritually weak, God sends him an angel to revive his spirit. The bread and water that Elijah was given strengthened him to continue on his journey. The Responsorial Psalm urges us to taste and see the goodness of the Lord. What we see in the Gospel is this very goodness of God that we are called to taste. In Jesus we are able to experience love in its fullness. When he feeds us with his body and blood, which indeed is the Bread from Heaven, we see the sacrificial love of Jesus, who wants to lead us on to eternal life, with him. To consume the Body and Blood of Jesus is to be nourished and sustained by his life, death and resurrection, which is a summary of God's life and love. When we receive Jesus into our lives, we are sealed with the Holy Spirit, who leads us on the path of truth and love. Anything contrary to love and truth cannot be a part of our lives, as St. Paul reminds us. We have to leave behind all that is not love and live as imitators of Christ, who was love personified. His self-gift is our sustenance on our journey towards fullness of life.
