Pastor's Note: The one who stills the **storms....**Last Sunday we were told that Jesus had special sessions with his Apostles to explain his teachings. These special sessions were meant for them to clarify the doubts that might arise in them, as they listened to the teachings of Jesus which, according to the people, were quite different from the ones taught by the Scribes. Priests and Pharisees. These special sessions should also have helped the Disciples to get to know Jesus more and understand who he was and what he was trying to accomplish. However, the reality is that they hardly understood who Jesus was or what his powers were. It is, therefore, not surprising to see the cry for help from the panic-stricken Apostles, as they were faced by a major storm. Embarrassing as it might seem, the fact is that, they were vet to know Jesus or trust him fully. The complaint of Job to God, when he faced adversities in his life, was also one that showed lack of understanding. Job felt entitled, because of his faithfulness to God, and he expresses his disappointment to God, when he loses all that was dear to him. He failed to understand that God was in total control and that God can intervene when he so wills. Indeed, he does intervene and restores the dignity of Job. In the same way, even though Jesus seemed to be not concerned of the danger faced by the disciples, the fact was that, Jesus always cared and he would not have let them perish. Faith is response to God. We respond to God for his actions in our lives and that of the world. Very often, our faith is about placing our needs before him, when they arise. Setbacks and misfortunes often test our faith in God. In fact, during such times, we question the love of God and his willingness to come to our rescue. When things do not happen the way we want them to happen, we doubt the existence of a loving God. This is where the second reading reminds us that we have become new creations in Christ. The old things have passed away. This also means that our old ways of thinking and acting have to change and begin to trust and be grateful to God even in the face of adversity and setbacks. God cares, and he will be there for us, as and when he deems fit.
