**HAVE A LAUGH . . . CROWD CONTROL**

No one moved, so he barked again, "Let's get off the corner!" Intimidated, the group of people began to leave, casting puzzled glances in his direction. Proud of his first official act, the young policeman turned to his partner and asked, "Well, how did I do?" "Pretty good," replied the veteran, "especially since this was a bus stop."

**Pastor’s Note: Rooted and grounded in love....** Jesus loves with an everlasting love. It did not matter to Jesus that those whom he loved did not live up to his expectations. He continued to love them, and it is this love that eventually transforms them. This love of Jesus is not just a verbal tribute to a relationship. Jesus always shows his love in action, and when it mattered most, he showed it by dying for those who he loved. For Jesus, the power to love in an unconditional manner came from his intimacy with God the Father. This intimate relationship began during the time of his Baptism, where God the Father told Jesus, that Jesus was his beloved Son. He then continued to nurture this love with his constant communications with the Father in and through his daily prayer. To drive home this aspect of rootedness in God, Jesus uses the imagery of vine and its branches. Just like Jesus who remained united with the Father and thus was able to fulfill the mission entrusted to him, we are also invited to be united with Jesus. Like the branches that get their energy and life from the vine, we have to remain in Jesus. The second reading reminds us that the way to be part of Jesus is to obey his commandments. The one commandment Jesus ask us to obey is to love the way Jesus himself loved. Our commitment to love is also a commitment to Jesus. When we are intimately connected with Jesus, by obeying his commandment, we will be able to produce good fruits. The first reading gives a clear example of this relationship and its effects. Paul, who was once a persecutor of Christians, is completely transformed, once he encounters Jesus and decided to follow him. He is then able to lead others to Jesus, in other words, is able to produce good fruits. This is our call as well.
