Pastor's Note: Seeking the living among the alive....

Forty days of Lent, a time of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving, culminates in the joyful celebration of Easter, which we commemorate this week. Easter is the celebration of life, not just of Jesus who rose from the dead, but also of everyone who is born into Christ, by virtue of their Baptism. It is the celebration of the New Life we all received when we were Baptized, a fullness of life towards which we are led each and every day. This weekend's Liturgy begins with the Easter Vigil, which we celebrate on the night of Holy Saturday. The most important aspect of this celebration is the Blessing of the fire and the lighting of the Easter candle. The whole ceremony celebrates the Light which Jesus brought into the darkness of our human sin, which resulted in death. We proclaim Jesus as the Light that dispels all the darkness of sin and death. Then, with lighted candles which we light from the Easter Candle, we process into the church and light up the church which has all the lights turned off during the procession. As we do the Easter Proclamation, after we take our places inside the church, we recall the great act of God, all through the history of humanity, where he came to the aid of human beings, culminating in the Resurrection of Jesus, our Messiah and Savior. Then we journey through time, as we read from the Scriptures and rejoice at the presence of God at every turn of event in history. Then, the Gospel reminds us that Jesus, who was tortured and killed and who was buried in a tomb, has come back to life again. As various readings from the New Testament would remind us, Jesus was rewarded with New Life for the love and obedience he demonstrated during his suffering and death. If the mood, as we left the church on Good Friday, was somber, the mood, as we leave the church on Easter, is joyous. The disciples were all crestfallen, when they witnessed the arrest, torture and death of Jesus. The women who accompanied him in his death also thought that the story of Jesus was over and that he has just become a distant reality. This is where the power of God intervened and transformed, not just the life of Jesus, but that of everyone. He is no more dead, but alive. Jesus is to be sought among us, who are called to live a life of fullness in him. Happy Easter!
