Did you know about the Saints ... On April 28, we celebrate Saint Gianna Beretta Molla. Gianna was a pediatrician in Magenta, Italy. She married in 1954 and had three children. During the pregnancy for her fourth child, a tumor was discovered in her uterus. Her doctors recommended an abortion as it would save her life. She had the doctors only remove the tumor and instructed her husband, "If you must decide between me and the child, do not hesitate, choose the child. I insist on it." Gianna died from complications a week after giving birth in 1962. She was canonized by Saint John Paul II the Great in 2004 with her husband and all four children present. She is the patron Saint of mothers, physicians, and unborn children.

On the other hand, it can only refer to the experiences of synodality lived, at different levels and with different degrees of intensity: valuable elements for discernment on the direction in which to continue to move are offered by their strengths and achievements, and also by their limitations and difficulties.
