Did you know about the Saints: On August 11th, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Clare of Assisi (1194 - 1254). At the age of 18, Clare first encountered Saint Francis and was drawn to him because he was not just preaching the gospel but was living the gospel. Clare left her family home and joined the convent of Benedictine nuns of San Paulo at the direction of Francis. Eventually Clare's sister, Agnes, joined her. When a dwelling was built next to the church at San Damiano, the two sisters moved. They soon began attracting others to what was to be a new Franciscan order. Initially they were known as the Poor Ladies of San Damiano and after Clare's death became known as the order of Saint Clare. The Canonization process for Clare began immediately after her death at the request of Pope Innocent. Pope Alexander IV canonized Saint Clare in 1255.

Pastor's Note: We have good news regarding **Parish Hall!** On August 17, this year, it will be five years since Hurricane Harvey caused extensive and life-changing damage to our town. We, as a Parish, were also dealt with a severe blow when our Church Building, Parish Hall and Rectory all suffered severe damage. Thanks to the hard work and generosity of the Parishioners, visitors, church leadership and with assistance from FEMA, as a first step, we were able to repair and restore the Church Building. Then, with the financial support from the Parishioners and various other donors who contributed generously to the Building fund, we were able to build a New Rectory and Parish Office and Educational Building in 2020. I want to thank God for being with us and guiding us in the process. I want to acknowledge the efforts put in by the Parishioners, especially the Building Committee. I recall with gratitude, everyone who worked so hard to raise funds for the building with their generous donations, rummage sale, raffle sale and other fundraising efforts. Every penny donated was put to good

Even though we were able to achieve a lot in the past five years, the state of the Parish Hall remained a concern for all of us. This was due to the fact that the Diocese, who officially is responsible for all church property, had applied for help from FEMA, and it took forever for them to come up with a decision. Finally, we have reached that stage where we are able to begin the work on repairing the Parish Hall. FEMA will fund the repair and restore it to its original state. The project has now been contracted. And, since they will only restore it to its original state, any change we, as a Parish, want to make to restructure the inside of the Hall to suit the current needs of the Parish, will have to be funded by the Parish. I am in the process of negotiating with the contractor to have the desired changes, with help from a new Building Committee. Thanks to the generosity of the Parishioners and visitors, we can draw the required amount from our Building Fund.

We need to keep adding to the Building Fund which is also used to take care of future repairs, maintenance of the buildings and any unforeseen expenses.

I want to sincerely thank everyone who donated. Let us continue to pray that the project will soon be completed and we will once again be able to gather in our Parish Hall, as a Parish Family! Thank you God, thank you everyone! God Bless you all!
