Pastor's Note: Praying to the one who will hear us....Having focused on the way a disciple is called to respond in various situations, this Sunday we focus on the way God responds to our needs. "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me", is the responsorial Psalm today, reiterating the largeheartedness of God. God comes to our help, every time we need him or we are in need of help. God is someone who is able to understand us and respond to our needs. The first reading from the book of Genesis throws further light on the compassionate nature of God. Abraham seems to be exploiting the compassion of God, when he argues with God about the possibility of good people getting punished for no fault of theirs. In doing so, Abraham himself is manifesting the compassion of God. God cares for the people and God is always willing to relent, when we raise our hearts in prayer. Yes, God is indeed compassionate and merciful. The compassionate heart of God is further stressed in the second reading, when Paul talks about the salvation brought about through the instrumentality of Jesus. We were living lives unworthy of God, and Jesus takes upon himself all our sins, and we are not only spared of punishment, but are made once again friends of God. This is because God understood our need. and he responded with mercy. Jesus was asking us to be other-centered and compassionate. This was, in fact, a call to be like God, who is compassionate and generous. It is this compassionate and generous nature of God that is stressed in the Gospel reading for this Sunday. "Ask and you will receive", is an oft repeated phrase from the Bible. Even though, in reality, we may not get everything we ask for, God is able to understand what we need and will always come to our aid. The examples of people responding to others, when they ask for things they want, serve as a backdrop to explaining the magnanimity of God. If humans can respond to others with kindness, in spite of their shortcomings and failures, how much more will the generous God respond to our needs, when we call upon him. We are going to be gifted with the Holy Spirit, as a way of enabling our prayer life and also to aid us in our response to others. God is generous and understanding. We can rely on him.
