Did you know about the Saints ... On June 9th, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Ephrem (306-373) who was born in Nisibis, Syria. Ephrem was a teacher and a dedicated member of the early Church who also attended the Council of Nicea. Ephrem understood that he could teach for many generations through writing commentaries and composing hymns. We have documentation of over 400 hymns composed by Ephrem which explains why he is referred to as the Harp of the Holy Ghost. Pope Benedict the XV canonized Saint Ephrem in 1920 and declared him a Doctor of the Church.

Pope Francis says: We ask the Lord for many things, but how often do we forget to ask him for what is most important and what he desires most to give us: the Holy Spirit, the power to love. Indeed, without love, what can we offer to the world?

Pastor's Note:Re-created in love....

The Feast of the Pentecost marks the launch of Christianity as a movement to transform the world. In that sense, it is the birthday of Christianity. The Feast is about the empowerment of the lowly disciples who were living in fear and who, after the death of Jesus, had no courage to face people. Strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit, the disciples boldly proclaims the Risen Christ to a multitude of people who were gathered in Jerusalem. Today is the celebration of this transformation, made possible by the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. In that regard, it is also the story of our transformation and re-creation. The First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles clearly portrays the dramatic impact of the receiving of the Holy Spirit. The tongues of fire which rested on each of them totally transforms their lives. Until then, they were confined to a house due to the fear that was ruling them and, with the reception of the Holy Spirit, they literally break loose. They then became proclaimers of the word and were gifted with the power to influence all the people who had gathered in Jerusalem for the feast. We are able to witness the instant manifestation of the power of the Spirit. Their preaching becomes the means by which numerous people came to believe in Jesus. It is a renewal of the face of the earth, as we pray in the Responsorial Psalm. There comes about a unification of the world, divided on linguistic barriers. Holy Spirit literally becomes the enabler. The Holy Spirit manifests itself in varied ways and yet the purpose is to help people to bring glory to God. The different charisms we find in people are the various ways in which the Holy Spirit enables each person to bring out the best in that person, in order to make use of that person's ability and life itself to lead people to God. That we are genuinely re-created in and through the Holy Spirit is clearly portrayed in the way Jesus gives the Spirit, in the Gospel passage. Jesus not only consoles the Apostles who are living in fear but also strengthens them with the Spirit. Like God, who breathed the breath of life on the human person in the account of creation, Jesus breathes his breath of love into the Apostles to re-create them and to send them forth. It is with this same breath of love that we are all re-created in Christ. We celebrate this new birth in the Holy Spirit today.
