

Pope Francis says: "Not that we loved God but that he loved us" (1 Jn 4:10). Let us never forget this. Our abilities and our merits are not central to faith, but rather the unconditional, free and unmerited love of God.





Pastor's Note: A God who restores the dignity of all.... In the past weeks, we have been reflecting on the attributes of God and the attitudes that we should have when we approach God. Our God is someone who brings justice to the poor and the oppressed. To approach such a loving God, we should have an attitude of humility in our hearts. This week we reflect on yet another aspect of God that brings comfort and consolation to a lot of people, especially the ones who are ostracized. The Responsorial Psalm praises God, because he is 'good to all and compassionate toward all his works'. It further reminds us that 'the Lord lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down". This is the theme of all the readings for this Sunday. The first reading from the book of Wisdom reminds us that the love of God is meant for all, because it is he who fashioned everyone. It reminds us that the Lord would not have made what he hated. And since everything and everyone was created by God, he cannot be hating anything that he created. The Lord's imperishable spirit is in everyone, and thus he calls for them to be purified and restored when they go astray. He is patient enough to wait for them, in order to restore their dignity. With the grace of God, we are to bring to fulfilment every good purpose he has for us, reminds St. Paul in the second reading. We are called to co-operate with God and act in accord with his will, so that we will glorify him through our lives. In other words, God is going to be with us and for us, when we live our life of faith. The Gospel narrates the famous encounter of Jesus with Zacchaeus, or rather the encounter of Zacchaeus with Jesus, which entirely transformed his life. Zacchaeus is described as the chief tax collector and a wealthy man. Since there was total contempt for tax collectors among the people in those days, he was not someone who dared to come publicly to meet Jesus. Jesus feels the desire of Zacchaeus to meet him, and even though he was perched on a tree, because he was short in stature, and takes the initiative to meet him in person and decides to dine at his home. This encounter changes Zacchaeus and thus the house experiences salvation. This is a reminder that the way God perceives people is not the way the world looks at them. Nobody is outside of the Lord's favor, because he does not despise anyone. He upholds the dignity of everyone, even the most disliked of all.
