Did you know about the Saints: On October 14, we celebrate the feast of Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991 – 2006). After Carlo's first communion, his devotion to the Eucharist grew and he did his best to experience the sacrament of Holy Communion daily. Carlo worked to model his modern life after several Saints including Francis, Dominic Savio, Jacinta and Francisco Marto, and Bernadette. Carlo's dedication to the Eucharist was clearly seen by his creation of a website committed to cataloguing Eucharistic miracles throughout the world. Pope Francis says: In the school of the Virgin Mary, let us treasure in our hearts the joyful, luminous, sorrowful and glorious mysteries of the Lord Jesus so as to become faithful disciples like her.



Pastor's Note: A God who is faithful to all....The story of the faithfulness of God is what the Scriptures narrate in varied different ways. This faithfulness of God is often contrasted with the unfaithfulness of his people. What makes the faithfulness of God especially noteworthy is the fact that his faithfulness to people was not in any way affected by the unfaithfulness of the people toward him. Since the Books of the Old Testament narrate the story of salvation from the point of view of the people of Israel, it often gives the impression that God has been faithful only to them. Since the Jewish people held the view that they were the chosen race, they also concluded that the Gentiles were not worthy of receiving the favor of God. In the New Testament, we see Jesus widening this world view of the people of Israel. Jesus freely mingles with everyone and does not discriminate against anyone or any group of people. Especially in the Gospel according to Luke, we see Jesus showing the Gentiles in a very positive way and reaching out to them to make them also part of the Kingdom of God. Today, we see all the readings focusing on this universality of God's favor and the way people who are faithful are not just limited to the Israelites. "If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself", says St. Paul, in the second reading, in his letter to Timothy. Denying anyone his faithfulness is like denying himself, because everyone is part of God himself. In the first reading, from the second Book of Kings, we see Naaman, the Syrian, in other words, a Gentile, experiences the healing from the God of Israel. God does not discriminate or deny his graces to anyone as the Responsorial Psalm reminds us, when it says, "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power". It further states that 'all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation by our God'. It is this openness and universalism that we see in the healing of the ten lepers in the Gospel passage today. Just like illness that does not distinguish between people, the power of God's healing also embraces everyone. That the only person to come back and thank Jesus was a Gentile, shows that Jesus does not discriminate in caring for everyone. When it comes to Jesus, what matters is not our social status or racial and religious differences, but the fact that we all belong to a God who is faithful to all of his children.
