Did you know about the Saints: On January 28, we celebrate the feast of Saint Thomas Aguinas (1225 – 1274). Even though Thomas is honored with the titles Doctor of the Church and Angelic Doctor, his fellow university students called him a "dumb ox". Thomas' contributions to the Church included many great writings which focus on faith and reason. The most famous of these is entitled Summa Theologiae which he left unfinished before he died. When questioned about his decision to stop writing, Thomas said "I cannot go on ... all that I have written seems to me like so much straw compared to what I have seen and what has been revealed to me." Thomas is buried at the convent of the Jacobins in Toulouse, France. Aguinas 101, a free video course regarding the teaching of Saint Thomas, can be accessed at aquinas101.thomisticinstitute.org.

Pope Francis says: What is the shortest way to encounter Jesus? Make yourself needy. Recognize your need for grace, your need for forgiveness, your need for joy. And Jesus will draw near to you.



Humility rewarded by God....We see Jesus continuing on his Mission and inviting people to join him with a total change in attitude, towards people and a way of life. Last Sunday we saw Jesus beginning his ministry by settling down in a region which was then considered forsaken. He lifts their morale by inviting them to join his ministry and chooses simple fishermen to continue his work. What we see and hear today, in the readings, is this continued emphasis of Jesus on humility as a way of life. What Jesus proposes is a radical departure from the common understanding about greatness. All the readings talk about God uplifting the poor and the despised and rewarding them with blessing. Since Matthew presents the Gospel to the Jewish Christians, he presents Jesus as the new Moses. Moses, for the Jewish people, is the one who brought them the Law, after encountering God on the mountain. The Law of Moses was the guiding principle that impacted the lives of the Jewish people. The Gospel passage is from what is commonly known as the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus goes up the mountain and, like Moses, gives the people a renewed set of rules. The disciples of Jesus are to live by this new set of rules and have to believe in a new way of God acting in the world. Jesus begins by upholding the poor and the people who are suffering. He proposes blessings on those sections of the society who are otherwise looked down upon. It is this uplifting of the simple and humble that we see in all the other readings for today. Through the Prophet Zephaniah, God proposes blessings on the humble and lowly. They will put their trust in God, and God will come to their aid. The Responsorial Psalm reiterates the fact that God will not abandon the oppressed and the neglected, and will always uphold their dignity and come to their aid. St. Paul reiterates the fact that Jesus chose not the wise and powerful, but chose the lowly to continue his mission. We are reminded that when we trust in God, and remain humble in our way of being, he will always come to our aid and impart his blessings upon us.
