Did you know about the Saints: On February 22, we celebrate the feast of the Chair or Cathedra of Saint Peter. The Cathedra is a symbol of the Bishop's authority as successor to the Apostles and is located in the Cathedral of a diocese. 

Pope Francis says: Lent is an occasion for conversion and internal renewal through listening to the Word of God, caring for brothers and sisters who need our help, and prayer, especially to obtain the grace of peace in the world.



Pastor's Note: Coming back to a loving **God**....As we enter the sacred Season of Lent, we are reminded of the tremendous love of our God. This reminder also serves as an invitation, invitation to return to him with hope and be reunited with this God of love. This invitation to return was emphasized in the readings for Ash Wednesday, when we heard Prophet Joel passionately urging us to return to the Lord. Returning to the Lord also means an acknowledgement that we had moved away from him. Now is the time to come home and once again be united with the Lord. On this First Sunday of Lent, the readings focus on the promise of God to be forgiving and merciful. The Responsorial Psalm underscores this compassion of the Lord, when we proclaim, "Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant." A covenant is an agreement made between two unequal partners. We can never measure up to the magnanimity of God and his grandeur, as the one who created us and redeemed us. The agreement he made with us shows his compassionate heart, which can make him forget our failures and to take us back, once again, as his beloved children. It is not God who forgets the covenant, but we human beings, who because of our erratic ways, fail to keep our commitment to God and his ways. Even in our failure God is not going to abandon us, but is calling us to come get back to him and to experience his merciful love. The first reading, from the Book of Genesis, presents the covenant God made with Noah, a promise that he will never again destroy the world. Even in the midst of destruction caused by our failures, God will remember and act with his merciful love. In order for us to be committed to the Lord, we have to be faithful to the Lord, as Jesus was, all through his life. There were constant temptations that came to Jesus, to stray away from the mission, his Father had sent him to fulfill. Because of his rootedness in the love of his Father, he was able to overcome all the temptations. He is presented as the model for us to imitate, as someone who was willing enough to sacrifice his life for us, so that we would be made clean. Our call this week is to bathe in this love and to be washed clean and to live as true children of God.
