Did you know about the Saints: On February 3, we celebrate the feast of Saint Blaise. Blaise was a doctor and Bishop of Sebastia which is in modern day Turkey. Many miracles were documented showing the intercession of Saint Blaise in the "Acts of Saint Blaise" which was written approximately 400 years after his death. Blaise also showed great kindness to animals which is why he is often depicted alongside wild animals. Tradition is that he would go into the woods frequently to feed and heal any wounded animals. In the year 316, Blaise was arrested for being a Christian. While in the hands of his captors, a woman laid her son who had a fishbone stuck in his throat at the Saint's feet. The child was cured but Blaise was still put to death for not renouncing his faith. The relics of Saint Blaise are located in the Cathedral at Dubrovnik, Croatia. "Saint Blaise, holy Bishop and Martyr, friend of animals great and small, intercede for us. Through thy prayers, may God preserve us from sickness and all other evils. Amen."

Pastor's Note: A God who consoles the sick....The Mission of Jesus springs from his awareness that God has sent him to make known to the people his compassionate love for them. Everything that Jesus would do and preach on, would be to enhance this compassionate love of God, especially for the afflicted people, who were waiting for the Lord to act. Last Sunday's readings focused on the authority with which Jesus taught, emphasizing the fact that the authority of Jesus came from God himself. Jesus is the true begotten Son of God, who can truly represent the ways of the Lord. It is this fulfillment of the hopes of the people that we focus on this week. The Responsorial Psalm puts it quite emphatically, when it says, "Praise the Lord, who heals the brokenhearted." It goes on to say that the Lord binds up the wounds of those who are injured and that he sustains the lowly. This is exactly what Jesus is doing in the Gospel passage we hear this Sunday. After teaching authoritatively in the synagogue, Jesus goes and heals the mother-in-law of Simon. This is not just one action by Jesus to heal someone who is unwell. People keep bringing to him everyone who is ill or is possessed by a demon. He is able to cure and transform the lives of all of them. Even on the following day, people keep looking for Jesus in order for him to heal them. Jesus, by then, had conversed with God, in prayer, and stresses the need for him to move to other towns, so that they, too, may experience the healing power of God. Jesus is convinced of his mission to preach the Good News to everyone and to bring about true healing in all of them. That those who are afflicted can turn to the Lord for help, is amply expressed in the first reading, from the Book of Job. When Job narrates his afflictions, it is in fact a cry to the Lord, in whom he had trusted, to deliver him from his misfortunes. We can always turn to the Lord for help when we face difficulties in our lives. St. Paul reminds us that our discipleship in Jesus is a call to be there for those in need, as the Lord has been there for us. We can surely experience the consolation of God and then be messengers of that consolation to those who are hurting.
