Did you know about the Saints: On January 17th we celebrate the feast of Saint Anthony of Egypt (251 - 356). As a young man, Anthony was provided a large inheritance. Attending church, he heard Jesus' conversation with the rich young man as documented in the Gospel. Anthony then understood the Lord's call to give his wealth to the poor and retreat to a life of prayer and solitude. His life proved to be attractive to others, and he eventually started what was to be an early monastery. Anthony supported those in prison during the Roman Persecution of 311 and stood up against the leaders of the Arian heresy. He is credited at being the founder of Christian monasticism. Anthony died in solitude at the age of 105.

Pastor's Note: Discerning God's will for **us...**Having concluded Christmas Season, we move into the Ordinary Time of the Year. In this Year B, on Sundays, we will be listening to Passages taken from the Gospel according to Mark. Ordinary Time of the Liturgical Year focusses on the public life of Jesus. It begins with a call of the Apostles, and this week we listen to a Gospel passage taken from the Gospel according to John. All the readings present some form of discernment when it comes to following the Lord. There is a desire to understand and do the will of God in the people presented in all the readings. This desire is well expressed in the Responsorial Psalm, when we say, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will." The readings present the difficulty experienced by the people who want to follow Jesus, in understanding the will of God and how they can effectively respond. There are others who come forward to help the ones who are called to understand the will of God and to respond properly to the Lord. The first reading, taken from the first Book of Samuel, presents this predicament in a very distinct way. Samuel is a boy who spends his time helping Eli, the high priest, and spends the night in the temple. He is not only devoted to serving Eli, but is also committed to serving the Lord. When the Lord calls out to him, he is not able to understand the meaning of that. It is Eli, who is able to help the young man respond to the call of God. With the help of Eli, Samuel is able to respond to God and spend the rest of his life doing the will of God. In the second reading we see St. Paul advising the people of Corinth, the way in which they are to serve the Lord. Because we, as followers of Jesus, belong to his body, we are to keep ourselves pure and holy. In the Gospel we see John's way of presenting the call of the Apostles. He presents the call as a search from the part of the Apostles, and their encounter with God brings about a change in their lives. Andrew helps Peter to meet Jesus, and this meeting with Jesus totally transforms him, since he is going to be called Cephas, from then on. All of us are called to discern the will of God for us, and respond with generosity.
