Did you know about the Saints: On April 5, we celebrate the feast of Saint Vincent Ferrer (1350 – 1419). Vincent entered the Dominican Order at the age of 19. After his ordination he became Prior of the Dominican house in Valencia, Spain. During a large portion of his life, the Western Schism divided the Church as there were two who claimed to be Pope. Vincent did his part to heal the separation and reunite the Universal Church by preaching the good news throughout Spain, France, Italy, Germany, England, Ireland, and Switzerland. He was able to see the end of the great schism in 1417 and the election of Pope Marin V but he died just two years later. It is said that Vincent is the patron Saint of Builders because he continuously worked to build up the Church. He is also the Patron Saint of Reconciliation.

Pastor's Note: Life bursts forth from **death....**Forty days of intense preparations have now ended. Our journey with Jesus, during his most painful moments of his life has now brought us, with him, to celebrate fullness of life. Today is the day we sing Halleluiah to the Lord, having restrained ourselves from doing so for forty days. Yes, today is the day to rejoice, to celebrate and to sing praises to the Living God. The celebrations we have on Easter Sunday centers around the Resurrection of Jesus. And yet, we know that the Resurrection of Jesus is not about his coming back to life again, but is also an assurance about our lives. The Resurrection of Jesus has paved the way for our own resurrection and the experience of life in its fullness. Jesus had invited us to carry our own crosses, if we wanted to be his disciples. Cross is not something we look forward to, since it signifies suffering and death. However, the Resurrection of Jesus has made it known, without any trace of doubt, that the cross indeed leads to life. Jesus looked defeated, during the time of his crucifixion, and the hopes of the people dashed. Today, we know for sure that the death of Jesus was not a symbol of defeat, but a statement on his power over all evil. He chose death, that we may have life with him. Easter vigil gives us an opportunity to recall the many ways in which God has been coming to liberate the people and culminating it with our deliverance from the clutches of sin and death. The readings for Easter Sunday proclaim the joy experienced by the Apostles and other disciples and the transformation they experienced as a result of this unexpected news and the encounter with the Risen Lord. Like them, we are also called to celebrate and to proclaim the Risen Lord, with our committed living.
