Did you know about the Saints: On May 25th, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Bede the Venerable (672-735). Saint Bede was a Benedictine Monk and Priest who spent the majority of his life at his monastery. He dedicated his life to the study of scripture and wrote biographical works about the Saints, commentaries on sacred scripture, homilies, and essays. He is best known for his book, Historia Ecclesiastical, which documents Christianity in England through the year 729. For this he is considered to be the father of English history. He was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1899 and is referred to as Venerable because of his great wisdom. It is reported that after finishing a translation of the Gospel of John from the Greek in 735, Bede sang the Glory Be and his soul went to heaven.

Pastor's Note: Called to perfect union....

Today we celebrate one of the major feasts we

celebrate during the Ordinary time of the year. Solemnities are the most important feasts of the Liturgical season. The solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity celebrates the very idea of God as the source of everything. The first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy presents the greatness of the God of Israel. The most transforming event in the lives of Israel was the Exodus event. The life and faith of the people of Israel was built around this experience of God delivering them from slavery in Egypt. The passage from Deuteronomy extolls the greatness and magnanimity of this God of Israel. In the midst of various groups of people worshiping different gods, Israelites start to believe in this one and only God to whom they profess their allegiance. The Responsorial Psalm highlights the fact that it was God who chose them to be his own. God, by choosing them to be his own, also expresses the love he has for the people. The second reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans reaffirms the love of God for all of us, who chose us to be his own. We are chosen to be adopted children of God, and our lives have to truly reflect the goodness of God, to whom we belong. It is the Spirit of God who will enable us to live such faithful lives. It is in the Gospel passage that we clearly see the idea of the Most Holy Trinity. Jesus instructing the Apostles to baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit is a clear expression of God as one, and yet having three distinct identities. This reality is expressed as three persons in one God, in later development of Christian Theology. Even though there are three persons, they remain in perfect unity and thus forming one existence. It is to this unity that we are all invited. Our union with God will enable us to reflect the unity of our Triune God. Even as we remain as one in God, we are also invited to bring people together into this perfect union. That is what Jesus is asking the Apostles to do, when he instructs them to teach others to observe what he had commanded them to do. Jesus invites everyone to be in perfect union with God.
