Did you know about the Saints: On August 7, we celebrate the feast of Saint Cajetan (1480 - 1547). Cajetan was born into a noble family in Vicenza, Italy. His mother was a devout Catholic and dedicated him to the Blessed Virgin Mary. As a child he was not only dedicated to his studies but also in his prayer life. Cajetan studied in Padua and earned a double doctorate in both canon and civil law. After his studies, he worked as a diplomat for Pope Julius II until the Pope's death in 1513. Three years later Cajetan was ordained as a priest. As a priest, Cajetan and his fellow priests worked hard to revive the zeal and piety of the clergy as a path to renew and uplift the Church. One of these friends later became Pope Paul IV. Saint Cajetan was canonized by Pope Clement X in 1671. Saint Cajetan, Pray for us!
