Teresa contracted Typhus the same year she entered the Carmelites and took her final vows before her death. Pastor's Note: He fills us with joy....

Lent, with its rigorous spiritual practices,

is also a time to anticipate the joy of being found and renewed in the Lord. Even though the events that would lead us through the Holy Week, very soon, presents some painful moments, the joy of Easter is what should help us navigate through those days of pain and gloom. This Sunday we are reminded of the great things the Lord has done for us. "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy" is what we proclaim in our Responsorial Psalm. In the first reading, taken from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, we hear the Lord coming to the rescue of people, who have been living in fear and desolation. During a time of hopelessness, forced to live in a foreign land, the people hear, through the words of Prophet Isaiah, that the Lord will gladden their hearts by giving them water to drink and, thus, will lift their spirits. He is not going to remember their wrong doing and will transform their mourning into joy. It is with this that they sing out to the Lord and praise him, saying that they shall come back rejoicing. It is this same goodness of the Lord, experienced through the person of Jesus Christ, that enables St. Paul to declare, in the second reading, that he is willing to count everything as a loss in order to gain Christ. Even though this experience of joy, gained through Christ, is something towards with he is journeying, he can already anticipate that joy, knowing fully well that the Lord will transform his life because of the love that the Lord has for him. We have confirmation, in the Gospel passage, that the Lord will do the unthinkable for us. When the entire Law and the defenders of the Law were against her, a woman caught in adultery experiences the merciful glance from the Lord of goodness. She is looked at with compassion and is set free from her physical and spiritual afflictions, which enables her to walk towards a new life of freedom and joy. Yes, the Lord does the unthinkable for us, and fills us with joy.
