As a member of the Franciscan order, he held many positions including that of novice master. Benedict never wanted to have a leadership position but served as he was called. Upon completion of his term, he humbly and joyfully returned to his previous position in the kitchen. Many came to the friary to seek his advice and he was so well loved that upon his death King Phillip III of Spain funded a tomb for Benedict King Phillip III of Spain funded a tomb for Benedict. Pastor's Note: Goodness of the Lord **unlimited....**Lent is a time to journey towards the Lord and experience the life that comes to us from the Risen Christ. It is with this hope that we undertake all the Lenten disciplines, even though it might involve sacrifices on our part. This week, the fourth week of Lent, reminds us that the joy that we are waiting for can already be experienced, even as we continue with our Lenten disciplines. Traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, or Rejoice Sunday, this fourth Sunday of Lent is, in fact, a welcome break, where we exult in the goodness of the Lord. The Responsorial Psalm reminds us to taste and see the goodness of the Lord. It is the goodness of the Lord that is evident in all the readings for the weekend. The first reading, from the Book of Joshua, presents the joy of the Israelites for having reaped the first fruits of the Promised Land. They praise the Lord, who fulfilled the promise he had made to them, when he brought them out of the land of slavery. In the second reading St. Paul reminds us that the gift of reconciliation that we received through Jesus Christ, is something that shows the goodness of the Lord. Having received that reconciliation, we are also transformed to be ministers of reconciliation. This was a gift from God, who loved us and believed in us, showing his goodness. In the Gospel we listen to the story of the Prodigal Son, who experiences the unconditional love of his father. Having left his father, after receiving his inheritance, the younger son in the parable ends up living a miserable life. It is this misery that brings him to the realization of the mistake he made. Upon his return, he experiences the all forgiving love of his father. The reading is a reminder that we have a God who is willing to shower his merciful love on each of us. Such is the goodness of the Lord, and it is this love that we celebrate on the fourth Sunday of Lent. It is also an invitation to be transformed into the image of this God of unlimited goodness.
