- 2. Spare coil, a coil to distributor wire, at least one spark plug and one spark plug wire
- 3. spare fuel pump with fittings, a 3 foot length of fuel-rated hose, 3 feet of vacuum hose
- 4. a set of fuses, a 3 foot length of wire with some connectors
- 5. a gallon of coolant, 2 quarts of oil, 2 quarts of ATF
- 6. the tools necessary to install all of the above and a moisture-proof container to put them all in
- 7. space for all of the above, especially if your car is a 1955 model
