R. Buckminster Fuller was an architect and he made this statement to explain how much of what shapes our world and life is beyond our senses. This is true in so many ways. The weather consists of air and pressure systems that we cannot see driven by forces half way

around the world. Our personalities are made up of electrons and neurons turning on and off in our brain that we can never observe. We are born into communities and societies that were set up long before we got there and subject to forces such as racism, class-ism, politics, marketing, and more that, although they lack physical presence, still exhibit great force.

More importantly we are flesh and blood human beings that are driven by our thought, desires, impulses, and our beliefs, and that reminds me of the catechism included in the Anglican Book of Common Prayer which defines a sacrament as "an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace." So not only are most of the forces that affect us invisible but the most important force, the grace of God, is not visible in the usual sense.

With that said, it can be seen. Grace can be seen whenever one person helps another, whenever one person forgives that they may be forgiven, whenever old enemies put aside their grudges and bury the hatchet, whenever a sick person regains health, whenever people lift one another up rather than tear each other down.

I cannot see the wind but I know it is there by the way it affects the trees and the flowers, not to mention my hair, and I know that grace is there not because I can see it, but because I see the way it changes the lives of those who have been touched by it.

May your life and our world continued to be touched by this amazing force.
