As the Super Bowl approaches and with the stepping down of Mike Tomlin as the coach of the Steelers I got to reminiscing about the last time the Steelers won the Super Bowl. When that happened, I celebrated the transformation of the city of Pittsburgh into the city of Sixburgh by going downtown to witness the parade.

It was a great experience of joy and jubilation but, because of the estimated quarter of a million people there, I wasn't really able to see much. People had been gathering as early as 5 AM so when I got there at 11:30 AM I was only able to just see the tops of a few heads as the players drove by. Eventually I made my way to the back of the stage and saw a few players from afar, and I got to thinking, what if Heaven were like this?

What if when we got there, there was a parade and we couldn't see Christ because of all the people who had already gotten there before us? This is similar to how it was when Jesus walked the earth. Crowds gathered around him and many longed just for a glimpse. The gospel of John tells of one man, Zacheus, who was short, so he climbed a tree just to get a look. I thought of Zacheus while I stood at the corner of Stanwix Street and the Blvd. of the Allies. There were no trees, but one person climbed a street sign, and I would be lying if I said I didn't consider it myself.

There are so many people in this world and so many Christians that it makes it hard to believe sometimes that Christ can care for and know each one us personally and intimately, and yet this is the promise he makes to us. I think that when we get to Heaven there will be a parade for all the newcomers and they will walk with Christ while the others cheer and clap.

In the meantime, I think that we are called to show Christ to one another. If Christ is only one person, then very few people will ever be able to know him personally, but if many people act like him and treat others the way he treated others, then many more will come to know him. Matthew tells us that when we help the needy "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

Likewise, when we do this, we represent Christ to other people, we take Christ out into the world and go to the people, so that they may see him face to face. No crowding, no climbing, no standing on tip toes or shoulders, just a personal, intimate encounter. Now that sounds super to me.

**Secretary's Minutes**  
**January 14, 2026**

**We Assemble on God's Name**

Moderator Gary Ford called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. He opened with a Scripture reading, prayer and lighting the Christ Candle.

**We Celebrate Our Past**

The FMCC Board reviewed submitted reports from the Senior Minister, Associate Pastor, Board Secretary, Treasurer and Church Clerk.

Moderator Gary Ford asked if there were any questions regarding these reports or if there were any comments from the person submitting the report.

Rev. Chris Stillwell added two additions to his report. He attended Literacy Council Meetings and invited those attending to activities of the church. He also added that he and the Elders performed hymn singings.

A motion to accept these reports was made by Dave Davis and seconded by Jerry Puskarich. The motion was carried unanimously.

**We Present Our Offering**

The FMCC Board reviewed the submitted Ministry Reports. Reports were submitted from the Trustees, Stewardship/Finance Ministry, Personnel Committee, and FMCC Croppers.

Moderator Gary Ford asked if there were any questions regarding these reports or if there were any comments from the person submitting the report.

Serena Dube asked what were the gift cards for that the Trustees purchased. Ed Palfreyman answered, those were for the Custodian and the Administrative Assistant.

Gary Ford also asked about the van sale. Ed Palfreyman answered the van was sold for \$2000.00.

Jerry Puskarich stated the internet service has much improved since the changing of the provider. His scanning time has decreased significantly.

Jerry Puskarich also stated the annual distribution for the Reese and Fawcett Funds. The details are in the Stewardship/Finance Ministry report.

A motion to accept these reports was made by Tom Wallace and seconded by Sheila Harris. The motion was carried unanimously.

**Concerns of the Past (Old Business)**

No Business was brought forth.

**Issues of the Future (New Business)**

Jerry Puskarich stated the Deficit Task Force (Gathering to Grow) would like to make this an ongoing ministry for the church to generate more revenue and fellowship.

Gene Sheller stated that we would need to amend the Constitution and go through the steps of creating a new ministry.

Jerry noted that someone suggested previously that we could add to an existing ministry. Pastor Gena suggested we wait until the meeting with the Pastor's Cabinet and the Deficit Task Force (Gathering to Grow) on January 26. It was decided to do that and follow up at the next Board meeting.

Rev. Chris Stillwell state that Soccer Shots who had inquired about using the Large Fellowship Hall has decided not to due to the fee of \$150 per use. They may still consider outdoor use in the summer.

Carol Davis inquired about the Red Robin Fundraiser. Pastor Gena said \$314.74 was raised, but the check is not here yet. It should be here around the first of February 2026.

Serena Dube questioned how was the church financially at the end of 2025.

Brian Shaw and Jerry Puskarich both answered that changes of internet carrier and moving around of hours for the custodian kept everything within the budget. They also stated the report breaks down every item.

Kevin Puskarich stated with the abundance of money we have at the end of 2025, should we be doing something to encourage more young people? Pastor Gena stated everyone should be asking what young people would like and focus on those ideas. She also stated would the church be willing to make those changes.

A motion to approve the Annual Reports was made by Gene Sheller and seconded by Ed Palfreyman. The motion was carried unanimously.

Gary Ford stated with the passing of Elder Carol Daniels, he is required to nominate someone as a replacement. He stated we would like to fill that position as Elder. A motion to accept the change in the Elders was made by Gene Sheller and seconded by Jody Mullis. The motion was carried unanimously.

Ed Palfreyman asked the Board for approval to pay Shearer Heating for fixing the pump motor as the bill was over \$1000. A motion to approve the request to pay Shearer Heating was made by Brian Shaw and seconded by Jerry Puskarich. The motion was carried unanimously.

Kevin Puskarich motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Ed Palfreyman. The motion was carried unanimously.
