One of the most quoted books in the Bible is the book of Psalms, and one of the most quoted psalms is Psalm 46 where God says, "Be still, and know that I am God". Here we have a meditation on the greatness of God that teaches us that we will only know the greatness of God if we meditate ourselves. God is so great and so



powerful. If we believe that God created the world then everything around us declares the wonder of God, and yet, how often do we notice all that is around us? We are busy people, and we are always on the go, so it is important that we remember this command to be still. The command to "be still" comes from the Hebrew word rapha which might better be translated as, "cause yourselves to let go" or "let yourselves become weak". So much of what we do is designed to focus us on ourselves and give us the illusion of being strong. As human beings we focus too much on our self and God calls us to be still, be weak, let go of ourselves, and

only then we will know that God is God.

When we take the time to be still, we stop striving and worrying and working. We stop pretending that it all depends on us, and then we hear the still, small voice of God and know where true strength lies. Remember what Paul said that "I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me." (2 Corinthians 19) When we are still, we see all that God is doing. When we are weak, we learn how strong God is. When we lose ourselves we gain so much more.

It is a powerful testament that God, who is so powerful, does not overwhelm us, but invites us to be still that we might accomplish so much. It is often hard to find the time to be still, to be quiet, to listen to that small voice that says is much more than all the loud voices we hear in our lives. That is why it is such a blessing to come to church, to push aside the clutter and the din of the week, to clear our minds, and rest our bodies. For some people it is the only peace and quiet they get all week. Come to church on Sundays to be still, and you may just hear God's voice well.

At the beginning of 2021, we as a group had little knowledge of the subject and had a lot to learn before we felt comfortable in performing all the safe conduct tasks that are required of our committee. However, we decided as a group to participate in getting background checks and taking the required training so that we could obtain a better understanding of just what Safe Conduct Policy means to us, the children that participate in church activities, our employees, and our volunteers who give much of their valuable time to help educate our youth.

During the Safe Conduct Policy Orientation Training that was held on July 25<sup>th</sup> and August 8<sup>th</sup> we as a group realized just how tuned in the children are to Safe Conduct. They listened carefully in the training and participated in real life examples of what is safe and proper and what is not. Our employees and volunteers have taken the online training which is required annually and have obtained two levels of background checks which are required, every three years. The Personnel Committee has worked hard to make sure each and every employee and volunteer is trained and in compliance. This gives us a greater level of comfort that our children, volunteers, and employees are better prepared to protect themselves. We as a committee have quickly learned that Safe Conduct can be utilized in all walks of life and that everywhere our children go, they can take simple steps that they have learned to protect themselves. That and knowing that God is with them gives the Personnel Committee a great level of comfort and pride knowing that Safe Conduct is there to protect them.


