People are much like stained glass windows. They sparkle and shine when the sun is out, but when the darkness sets in, their true beauty is revealed only if there is a light from within. --Elisabeth Kubler-Ross

These words by the famed psychiatrist shine with the truth. I have long been enamored with the beauty of our windows, as I know you have and others who visit our church have been as well. There is a downside to having a sanctuary of stained glass windows, however, and that is that stained glass does not let in as much light as does regular glass. This is fine on sunny days because the stained glass takes the sunshine and transforms it into a dazzling kaleidoscope of light, but on dark and gloomy days the windows make the sanctuary darker than it would be if the windows were simply plain, transparent glass.

At these times the beauty of the sanctuary depends upon the lights inside. Of course there are the lamps and the candles, but the true lights come from each of you sitting in the pews. Likewise, as Kubler-Ross attests, your light comes from inside. The Gospel of John tells us "What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:4-5) Jesus would again say 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.' (John 8:12)

Jesus is our light, but we do often try our best to block it from shining forth. Our guilt, selfishness, obsession with small and insignificant things often causes us to be like an old grimy stained glass window where the light within has a hard time shining forth. The call for each of us is to work to let our light shine. What that means to me is to be someone who radiates joy and peace, compassion and warmth so that people who are accustomed to the darkness of the world will be drawn to you like a moth before a flame.

May the light within you shine forth, not only in the sunshine but also in the darkness, especially in the darkness, and always remember that the source of light within you is the light of the world, Jesus Christ.


