### **Ash Wednesday and Lenten Devotionals**

It seems like Christmas was only yesterday and already we are preparing for Easter. Of course Easter is still many weeks away, but, just as Christmas has a season of preparation which we call Advent, so too does Easter have a time of preparation which we call Lent, and this year it begins on February 14. Lent marks the time when Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness facing temptation, fasting, and praying before he began his public ministry, and we are invited to spend 40 days honing our faith and going deeper on our walk with Christ. There are many opportunities for us to do so at Fairhill this year.

First is our annual Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of our preparation. The day gets its name from the practice of having the ashes of last year's palms imposed upon our forehead to remind us of our mortality, and that we would be nothing more than ash if it were not for what has been accomplished through Jesus Christ. So I invite you to come to our special Ash Wednesday service February 14, from 5-6pm. We will have song and scripture, prayer and short meditations, ashes will be received and communion will be shared. The service will also be on Zoom, and if anyone would like to receive ashes but cannot make the service, please let me know, and Pastor Gena and I will arrange a time to give them.

Another way for us to go deeper in our faith is through our Lent devotional that we have chosen titled, "Go to Jerusalem," which will help you contemplate what it means to truly follow Jesus. It will be available to pick up at church on Sunday, February 11. We invite you to take one per family and use it on your spiritual journey to Easter. We also hope you will join us in a discussion of the readings which will be hosted by Rev. Chris and Pastor Gena on Mondays at 7pm during Lent via Zoom starting February 19.

## Fairhill Manor Christian Church Board Report Secretary Minutes January 10, 2024

#### We Assemble in God's Name

Moderator Gene Sheller called the meeting to order at 7:01pm by lighting the candle representing the Holy Spirit. He opened the meeting with a prayer.

#### We Celebrate our Past

The FMCC Board reviewed the submitted reports from the Senior Minister, Associate Pastor, Board Secretary, and Treasurer.

Moderator Gene Sheller asked if there were any questions regarding these reports or if there were any comments from the person submitting these reports.

In his Senior Minister's report, Rev. Chris mentioned Jill and Owen as new Deacons in 2024. Chuck Riggle asked for Jill's last name and was told it is Throckmorton.

Linda Reese questioned how much money was raised when Fairhill Manor rang the bells for the Salvation Army on December 14, 2023. The Salvation Army will have to be contacted to see if they can give us that information.

A motion to accept these reports was made by Carol Daniels and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Linda Reese. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### We Present Our Offering

The FMCC Board reviewed the submitted Ministry Reports. Reports submitted were from the Elders, Trustees, Stewardship/Finance Ministry and Personnel Committee.

Moderator Gene Sheller asked if there were any questions regarding these reports or if there were any comments from the person submitting these reports.

Jerry Puskarich submitted written bullet-point notes from the Stewardship/Finance Ministry and the Personnel Committee (included with these minutes). He noted that the revised Gifts, Memorials, and Bequest Policy has been voted on twice by the Board already as required by the old policy and will be presented to the congregation for a vote at the Congregational Meeting on January 21. Also, he stated he has completed the scanning of 2022 financial records.

The Stained-Glass Roof Project was discussed. Kevin Puskarich gave an update of the status of the project. We are hopeful to have a final plan in order by the next board meeting.

Rev. Chris expressed wanting to use the Church van during the Sunday School time to pick up Shut-Ins and anyone else who needs transportation to worship.

Gene Sheller let the Board know the Pastors have been given \$25 gift cards (paid for from the Notes of Thanks) to give to those in need. He reminded the Board that what used to be called the Christian Men's Fellowship (CMF) is now called the Disciples Men. The Disciples Men's treasury is now included in the church's Operating Account as an escrow fund named "Disciples Men Fund."

Von Lacock informed the board that a request by a 12-Step Program for usage of the Large Fellowship Hall every Saturday was declined since we could not accommodate this. McDonalds will use the Small Fellowship Hall for two Thursdays in January and two Thursdays in February for employee training for \$100 each day, total of \$400.

A motion to accept the Ministry Reports was made by Connie Sheller and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Peggy Oliverio. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **Concerns of the Past (Old Business)**

Tammie Wallace had brought up the need for emergency contacts for congregational members in a prior Board Meeting. Pastor Gena revisited this idea and it was discussed and agreed that an emergency contact and voluntary medical information would be requested from each member. Candy Wasalasky is checking to make sure HIPPA laws are adhered to and a form will be developed. This information will be Confidential, stored in the password-protected church database and only accessible by Rev. Chris, Pastor Gena and Karen Thomas. Having emergency medical assistance equipment readily available at the Church was also discussed.

A motion was made to create an Emergency Contacts Program by Candy Wasalasky and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Serena Dube. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### **Issues of the Future (New Business)**

No New Business brought forth.

#### Leaving in God's Name

Carmen Oliverio made a motion to adjourn the meeting, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol Daniels. The meeting was adjourned by Moderator Gene Sheller. Rev. Stillwell closed the meeting with a prayer.
