Children's Message*

I wonder if you have ever gone through something hard. Maybe there was a time when you were really disappointed about something, or when someone you loved died or moved away, or when you were really sick? Did anyone make you feel better during that time just be being with you? Why do you think their presence helped?

There was one time when I was far away from home in a really unfamiliar place. I only knew a few people there. I got really sick with something kind of like the flu. I didn't know how to get what I needed to take care of myself in such a different place. I was alone all day in a dark, hot room, and no one came around to ask how I was or what was wrong. I was so scared. And then in the evening, one of the people I worked with came to look for me because he hadn't seen me around all day. As soon as I saw him, I knew I would be ok. He got me something to drink and something really easy to eat. He made sure I had what I needed and was comfortable. But mostly, he sat with me and encouraged me. I was so thankful.

Today's scripture comes from Paul's letter to the Romans. In it, Paul says when life is really hard and we are suffering, God never abandons us. Even if it feels like God isn't there and we are alone, we're not. Paul reminds us nothing in the whole world, not even death itself, can separate us from the love of God. This doesn't mean things will never be hard, or that God will fix the suffering. But we can take comfort that even in the hard places, we are not alone.

I think that sometimes God is with us through other people. I am sure God was with me that time in that faraway place through my co-worker who came to help me and be with me. We can do the same thing for others. We can practice a "ministry of presence" and comfort others who are struggling just by being with them. In this way, we are showing the love of God.

Loving God, thank you for always being with us no matter what. Help us find comfort in this truth, even when things are hard. Amen.

Sermon*	"And Anything Else?"	Rev. Collins

The Apostle Paul is building to a crescendo his case for faith in Jesus as the way of salvation just as surely as a conductor of a symphony. He's making the case for the gospel of Christ of which he clearly states in the first Chapter of Romans, he is not ashamed. And step by logical step he leads these readers of his

letter through the plan for God's salvation. And now in this eighth chapter he writes what is truly one of the most profound expressions of the whole gospel.

And he begins this final rush to this powerful passage with a lengthy description of the benefits of being a believer in Christ and gaining through that belief the gift of God's Spirit. And almost like the sales pitch for a late night 'as seen on TV' product he lists these benefits for his Roman audience. But wait, there's more...call before midnight tonight and get even more... as a child of God, part of God's family, you receive the strength of the Spirit, so that even on your weakest days, feeling unable to pray, overwhelmed with problems, feeling ashamed or too bashful to step forward and pray to God as you would like...God's Spirit, living within you, will interpret the sighs too deep for words, or the pains too harsh to express, or the cries too primal to explain and God will know your needs and concerns even before you can utter them. Nothing with the Spirit is lost in translation. From your most public joy to your most secret embarrassment...the Spirit makes it known to God. Closer than your parent, more aware than your spouse, more empathetic than your best friend...you have a counselor and guide present at all times.

Paul says that in God's Spirit both the good and bad that occur within our lives are eventually resolved as good for us. Not that they are good as they happen and not that we see any way for them to work out right, but as part of God's family God brings all things to a redemptive end. Our vision, especially in times of pain and disappointment is so narrowed to be like tunnel vision...and so confined to our immediate needs that we become profoundly nearsighted, unable to see the wider picture or what lies just beyond. Living in the Spirit as a follower of Christ, gives us the benefit of a companion and advocate...and a friend with a vision of the future.

But wait there's more!

The greatest benefit of all for a follower of Christ is, yep, you guessed it...God's love. And for Paul it was not just a question of the quality of God's love, of its unconditional nature, but of its permanence and invincibility. He boldly states his defense by asking, "If God is for us, who is against us?" To demonstrate the depth and power of this love Paul builds off of the 18th verse of this classic 8th Chapter that we read last week when he said I consider the sufferings of this present time...and what sufferings are those? Paul details them for us now in this text for today as he writes of what suffering might cause us to be separated from God's love...Hardship, distress, persecution, famine, nakedness, peril, or sword? Perhaps we would add cancer, Covid 19, job loss, declining markets...Paul then makes a bold statement of what our belief in Jesus and God's salvation can offer when he says...none of these things can separate us from God's love...for we are more than conquerors through him who loved us...what could that mean. As any competitive person knows winning is great, but how can you be better than the best...more than a conqueror, greater than the winner?

Has Paul gone too far? Pushed the hyperbole beyond belief? I think not...for in his context of what we receive through our faith in Christ, by receiving the Spirit of God to dwell within us, we receive God's love that overcame the powers of evil and death and by Christ's resurrection we no longer have to fight the battle for ourselves...more than conquerors who still have to fight another challenger. And how can Paul top this bold statement of faith...I'll let him speak for himself:

"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Anything Else?

And remember that, as our scripture says, no matter how different we are, "nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Thank God for creating us with different abilities and being able to accept and appreciate those differences in others.




