As we come into March this year we also come into the season of Lent. Lent is the time on the church calendar that recalls Jesus' time in the desert being tested and tempted before he began his ministry. It takes place 40 days before Easter (excluding Sundays) and is a time of testing and temptation as Christians try to find ways to improve themselves in preparation for Holy Week and the Easter celebration. To this end it is customary to give something up for this time that will make you better in some way.

I don't remember my church celebrating it much when I was young and cannot say that I fully understood what it was until I went to seminary and learned much I didn't know about church history, liturgy, and tradition. In fact as a kid I would hear the kids on the bus who went to the local catholic school, Corpus Christie, use the word and I thought they were talking about lint, the fluffy gray stuff that gets on your clothes and stuck in your bellybutton. I laugh at it now, but I still sometimes make that association when I think that during Lent we strive to remove things from ourselves that shouldn't be there. We try to remove anger and bitterness, devotion to false gods, or reliance on crutches. We work to get rid of things that, like lint on a black sweater, keep us from presenting our best selves to the world.

These things are hard to remove for they cling and stick with tenacity, but Christ is to us like a brush that comes and wipes us clean. In the end that is what Lent is about. It reminds us that we are not perfect and need to get better, and it reminds us that we need Christ's help to do it. Finally, it reminds us that Christ understands our trials and temptations because he also faced them, but he resisted and passed the tests. It is always a good idea when trying to accomplish something to seek the help of one who has been there and succeeded, so as we begin the process of improving our spiritual life let us turn to the one who can remove all sin like a brush removes each speck of lint trusting that he who conquered death will also help us conquer temptation.
