Whenever the disciples misunderstood Jesus he was there to correct them. Even up until the end he does this with Thomas who doubted his resurrection, with Cleopas on the road to Emmaus, and with Peter on the shore of the sea. It must have been so great to have the Messiah right there to correct them when they misunderstood, but what are we to do when we don't understand?

We have something that the disciples do not have which is the New Testament, but sometimes it can be confusing and certainly Christians have spent a great deal of time arguing over its meaning, so what should we do? I have always thought of the teachings of Christ as a lens through which we must look at the Bible. So when reading a passage we should ask ourselves "Is my understanding of this passage in keeping with what Jesus taught? Of course Jesus taught many things, but what he taught the most was love. A friend of mine calls this the love filter through which all scripture must pass.

Perhaps the best illustration I have come across is that of Adam Hamilton who suggests that anytime you're unsure about what the Bible is trying to tell you, run it through the colander of Jesus' teachings. Just like your pasta strainer at home the colander of Jesus' teaching can help us wash away the cultural and temporal understandings of scripture and reveal the eternal, timeless truth that God is trying to tell us.

Whenever you come to a tough passage in the Bible, run it through the colander that Jesus gives us with the great commandment, which is to love God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself. If you somehow come away from the Bible feeling empowered to judge or exclude someone, you're doing it wrong. Run it through the colander of Christ again, and I can guarantee you that the new answer will be different and more difficult. It's easy to use the scriptures to condemn and to put down, but if you do then you need Christ to correct you and though he is not here his teachings are. Run your faith, your theology, your understanding of scripture through the colander of Christ's teachings again, and do not stop until the only thing not washed away is love.


