Yes it is August. Yes it is extremely hot outside. But the planning for the 2023 Drive-Thru Nativity has begun. The Drive-Thru Nativity dates are **December 9 and 10**. Please be praying and thinking about how you can serve in this large event.





If you have any non-perishable food items you would like to donate to the Community Circle Food Pantry, you can continue to bring them in and place them on the table by the coffee station in the front entrance of the church. Rev. Chris will take them to the pantry at the beginning of each month. **Items** needed most at this time are: cereal, jelly, peanut butter, shampoo and soap. If you or someone you know would like to volunteer or are in need of the Food Pantry's services, they distribute the food every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9-12. The Community Circle Food Pantry is located at 69 E. Pine Ave in Washington, and they can be reached at 724-225-1540.



There will be a youth activity for all children 5 and older on **Sunday, September 24**. After packing the CWS School kits, the youth will have lunch and then participate in a Jenga tournament which will lead into a conversation about the way in which we build our faith. We will also have a Sundae bar and conclude at 2:30pm. Please let Rev. Chris know how many are coming by September 17 so that we can plan lunch accordingly.



Fairhill Manor continues to collect:

Plastic caps — We are still collecting bottle caps for the Washington Park bench project. Place your caps in the container in the Narthex. Please make sure your caps are CLEAN and do not have any paper in the caps.

Empty medicine bottles - We are collecting **empty medicine bottles**. The bottles will be sent to Matthew 25 Ministries in Cincinnati. Place bottles <u>with caps</u> in the collection container in the Narthex.

Acceptable collection items include:

- Prescription pill bottles (large and small)
- Pill bottles with and without secure caps (child-resistant). Must include cap.

CWS School Kits – There are still tags on the bulletin board in the Narthex for needed supplies to complete the Church World Service School Kits.

- Choose one or more tags from the bulletin board in the Narthex. Be careful to purchase exactly what is listed on the tag. Remove all packaging from the items you have purchased and return the items to the container in the Narthex by Sunday, September 10.
- If you are unable to purchase items for the School Kits you can contribute money to purchase bags for the School Kits or to help ship the School Kits. Take one or more coin envelopes from the bulletin board in the Narthex. Place your cash or check (made payable to Fairhill Manor with "School Kits" in the memo) in the envelope and place the envelope in the offering plate. Or give on Givelify to "CWS Kits."
- Plan to stay following worship on September 24 to pack School Kits.

Safe Conduct Policy Orientation

As required by our **Safe Conduct Policy** at Fairhill Manor, we will be hosting a yearly orientation to the policy and how we interact in safe and healthy ways while in church programs. All children/youth ages 3+ who anticipate participating in any programs at Fairhill Manor during the 2023-2024 year (Children Worship & Wonder, Sunday school, youth activities, etc.) are required to participate. At least one parent or guardian needs to be present for each child. If the young person in your life lives out of state and participates in Fairhill programs while visiting you, you need to attend the orientation and share this important information with them.

This year's orientation will be held during the Sunday School hour (9-10 am) on September 10, 2023 (the first week of Sunday school). A donut breakfast will be provided. Please respond to Rev. Protect Yourself from Scams

In the wake of recent arrests involving scams against older Pennsylvanians, the Office of Attorney General (OAG) is again reminding people of all ages to be on the lookout for someone trying to cheat them out of their hard-earned money.

Some tips to keep in mind:

- Never send money or gift cards to someone you do not know. Also, gift cards are for gifts, not for paying debts or bills.
- If you are suspicious or have concerns about a solicitation, call your local police or the OAG hotline at 800-441-2555.
- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
 "Sweepstakes" scams have been common for
 years, so be vigilant and use common sense. If
 you did not sign up for a sweepstakes, you could
 not have won.
- Sign up for scam warning text alerts from the Office of Attorney General. Mobile carrier rates may apply.



Additionally, the OAG recommends an acronym to evaluate unsolicited phone calls or emails:

- S: Sudden The call or email is unexpected.
- C: Contact Scammers will contact you by phone, email or in-person.
- A: Act Now The request will be urgent and assert penalties if you do not act quickly.
- **M**: Money or Information The scammer will request money or personal information.

Pennsylvanians who believe they have been victims of a scam should file a complaint with the Office of Attorney General's Bureau of Consumer Protection by calling 800-441-2555 or emailing scams@attorneygeneral.gov.
