Fairhill Manor Christian Church Board Report Secretary Minutes September 11, 2024

We Assemble in God's Name

Moderator Gene Sheller called the meeting to order at 7pm by lighting the Christ Candle and sharing a meditation from Proverbs 23:18 noting 9/11 "never forget." Rev. Stillwell offered an opening prayer.

We Celebrate our Past

The FMCC Board reviewed the submitted reports from the Senior Minister, Associate Pastor, Board Secretary, and Treasurer.

Moderator Gene Sheller asked if there were any questions regarding these reports or if there were any comments from the person submitting these reports.

Brian Shaw, Treasurer, highlighted from his report that there is a deficit of \$29,000 in the general fund. The Skylight Project is paid off and the Roof Project will be finalized in October with \$6,800 still being owed.

Rev. Stillwell noted the Tri-County Men's Dinner in Connellsville is on September 19 and the trip to the Outdoor Living Word Drama in Cambridge OH is on October 20. Also the Bi-Regional Assembly (PA and WV) is on October 17 & 18 at First Christian Church in Washington.

A motion to accept these reports was made by Linda Reese and 2nd by Candy Wasalasky. The motion was carried unanimously.

We Present Our Offering

The FMCC Board reviewed the submitted Ministry Reports. Reports submitted were from the Elders, Trustees, Stewardship/Finance Ministry and Personnel Committee.

Moderator Gene Sheller asked if there were any questions regarding these reports or if there were any comments from the person submitting these reports.

Ed Palfreyman noted that the Trustees have completed the painting of the front steps, the back steps have been replaced and the parking lot has been sealed and lines repainted. The railing for the back steps should be completed in the next week.

A motion to accept the Ministry Reports was made by Ed Palfreyman and 2^{nd} by Brian Shaw. The motion was carried unanimously.

Concerns of the Past (Old Business)

No old business was brought forth.

Issues of the Future (New Business)

1. Calling Commission – Moderator Gene Seller stated that it is time for the Calling Commission to identify replacements for Officers who are going off the Board.

- 2. Moderator Gene Sheller distributed a draft amendment to the Constitution and/or Bylaws (see attached) for Board Members to consider. It will be discussed at the November Board Meeting.
- 3. Chuck Riggle congratulated Pastor Gena and Rev. Chris on the rededicating the stained glass skylight and dedicating the newly-installed protective covers service. It is so good to see it cleaned and protected.

Pastor Gena asked for prayer requests and then closed the meeting with a prayer.



Thankfulness Bible Study beginning on Wednesday October 23 from 11am-12pm via Zoom



Rev. Chris will be using Sarah Young's book, "Jesus Calling: Practicing Thankfulness" to lead a Bible study about why and how we should give thanks in all things.

Each of us has a choice in the type of "lens" we use to view our lives. Some of us view our lives through a lens of "lack." We keep a mental inventory of everything we don't have and worry there won't be enough for us in the future. Others among us view our lives through a lens of "abundance." We notice everything that we do have, thank God for providing those things for us, and then choose to live our days depending and trusting in God to keep on providing for us in the future.

We will spend six weeks exploring how we can switch our perspective to view our life more through the lens of abundance than of lack. In doing so we will look at what the Bible has to say about the many ways that God provides for us and we will spend time keeping a gratitude journal to help us. You do not need to purchase the book to participate in the study. Just join on Zoom and we will gather together to give thanks for God's blessings.
