AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to the sale of unfinished frames or receivers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new article 39-DDDD to read as follows:

ARTICLE 39-DDDD

SALE OF UNFINISHED FRAMES OR RECEIVERS

5 Section 898-f. Definitions.

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898-g. Sale of unfinished frames or receivers.

§ 898-f. Definitions. For the purposes of this article:

- 1. "Unfinished frame or receiver" means a frame or receiver of a firearm, rifle or shotgun whose fire-control cavity is completely solid and un-machined, and which may readily be made into a functional frame or receiver through milling, drilling or other means and includes any other object, part or combination of parts which is not a functional frame or receiver but is designed or intended to be used for that 14 purpose and can be readily made into a functional frame or receiver.
- 15 2. "Firearm" has the same meaning as that term is defined in 18 U.S.C. 16 **921(a)(3).**
- 17 3. "Rifle" has the same meaning as that term is defined in 18 U.S.C. 18 921(a)(7).
- 19 4. "Shotqun" has the same meaning as that term is defined in 18 U.S.C. 20 **921(a)(5).**
- 21 § 898-q. Sale of unfinished frames or receivers. 1. In addition to any
- 22 other requirements pursuant to state and federal law, all sales, including, but not limited to, sales from online retailers, of any unfinished
- 24 frame or receiver shall be conducted in accordance with this section.

EXPLANATION -- Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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2. Before any sale pursuant to this article, a national instant crimi-1 2 nal background check shall be completed by a dealer, licensed pursuant 3 to section 400.00 of the penal law, who consents to conduct such check, and upon completion of such background check, shall complete a document, the form of which shall be approved by the superintendent of state police, that identifies and confirms that such check was performed. 7 Before a dealer who consents to conduct a national instant criminal 8 background check delivers an unfinished frame or receiver to any person: 9 either (a) the national instant criminal background check system (NICS) 10 or its successor shall have issued a "proceed" response to the dealer, or (b) thirty calendar days shall have elapsed since the date the dealer 11 contacted NICS to initiate a national instant criminal background check 12 13 and NICS has not notified the dealer that the transfer of the unfinished frame or receiver to such person should be denied. Such background check 14 15 shall be conducted as if such unfinished frame or receiver was a 16 complete firearm, rifle or shotgun of the same model.

- 3. In addition to the background check required pursuant to subdivision two of this section, before a dealer delivers an unfinished frame or receiver to any person, if such unfinished frame or receiver does not have a serial number, such dealer shall conspicuously engrave, cast or stamp such unfinished frame or receiver with a serial number the form and content of which shall be approved by the superintendent of state police.
- 4. All dealers shall maintain a record of such transactions conducted pursuant to this section and such record shall be maintained on the premises mentioned and described in the license and shall be open at all reasonable hours for inspection by any peace officer, acting pursuant to his or her special duties, or police officer.
- 5. Any record produced pursuant to this section and any transmission thereof to any government agency shall not be considered a public record for purposes of article six of the public officers law.
- 32 <u>6. Any person who knowingly violates the provisions of this article</u> 33 <u>shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor punishable as provided for in</u> 34 <u>the penal law.</u>
- 35 § 2. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 36 have become a law.
