Hint: () have 2 legs (walk), 2 Eyes (sight), and 2 ears (hearing) = To walk my post in a military manner...

3. To report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.

Hint: (3 strikes law = 3 violations) = To report all violations of orders...

4. To repeat all calls from posts more distant from the guard house than my own.

Hint: (When you're golfing you yell FORE!, everyone repeats it, for people in the distant, so no one gets hit on the head) = To repeat

5. To guit my post only when properly relieved.

Hint: (You quit work at 5pm) = To quitmy post only...

6. To receive, obey and pass on to the sentry who relieves me, all orders from the Commanding Officer, Command Duty Officer, Officer of the Deck, and Officers and Petty Officers of the Watch only.

Hint: (This is the 6th order, and there's 6 people: the sentry, CO, CDO, OOD, Officer and petty officer) = To receive, obey and pass

7. To talk to no one except in the line of duty. Hint: (7 deadly sins) = To talk to no one...

8. To give the alarm in case of fire or disorder.

Hint: (Think of Wendy's, think of the 8 alarm burger) = To Give the alarm...
