Then, amidst chantings, the performer gently blows the redhot samidh and the fire rises up. Thereafter, ghee is offered and the participants meditate upon Agni. The success of a homa depends upon how the participants relate to the fire god Agni because he serves as the medium between this mortal world and the other mystical worlds. After agni dhyanam or meditating on Agni is done, the fire god is decorated by placing flowers on the eight corners of the homekund amidst chanting. Water is sprinkled on all the four sides of the kund and thus Agni becomes ready to necept the offerings offered to him.

This is like the heart of the homa. The entire homa depends upon the Sankalpa or the strong will of the participants. Each homa is performed for a definite purpose and every performer and participants clearly hold this purpose within their hearts as they take Sankalpa. The Sankalpa mantra itself is a very clear declaration stating that - in this month, in this season, on this day of the brighter/darker phase of the moon, at a time when this particular constellation is ruling (each day is supposed to be ruled by one of the twenty seven important stellar constellations called Nakshatras), I am performing this particular homa to invoke and please this deity under the guidance of Shri Kalki & Amma for this individual/family, who is/are born under this sign of the zodiac and ruled by this Nakshatra.

9. Pradhan Homa (Main Homa)

Pradhan homa means "the main homa". This is when the main mantra pertaining to the Pradhan Devta or the main deity is chanted 108 times continuously along with the chanting of the Moola mantra or the main mantra, various Ahutis or offerings like nine grains, medicinal berbs, dry fruits, rice cooked in glee, cooked rice mixed with jaggery, silver flowers, gold flowers, black sesame seeds and various others are offered into the fire. The offerings are never the same and differ from homa to homa because each deity responds to a particular offering. The common

has been the most neglected branch of Indian spiritual tradition and it is an accused or being a kind of black magic. But the follower of tantra is fundamentally the same as the vedic follower.

The various practices of Tantra are – Hatha Yoga, Pranayam, Mudras, Rituals, Kundalini Yoga, Nada Yoga, Mantra, Mandala, Visualization of deity, Alchemy, Astrology, Ayurveda and several other esoteric practices for generating wordly and spiritual prosperity.

Tantra Yoga lays special emphasis on the development of the powers latent in the six Chakras, from Muladhara to Ajna. Kundalini Yoga actually belongs to Tantric Sadhana which gives a detailed description about this serpent-power and the Chakras (plexus). Entire Tantric Sadhana aims at awakening the Kundalini and making it to unite with Lord Sadasiva in the Sahasrara Chakra.

Tantra & Vedas

A number of writers and teachers have tried to divide the

two great traditions of India of Veda and Tantra as different or even contrary. They see the Vedic tradition as Aryan and patriarchal and the Tantric tradition as non-Aryan and matriarchal. They identify the Vedic tradition with invading Aryans and the Tantric tradition with indigenous Dravidians. They see the Tantric as worshipping the Mother Goddess and the Vedic as rejecting her. They imply that Vedic and Tantric ideas and practices are very different.

Vedic and Tantric traditions are one, though with different orientations. The Vedic tradition is an earlier form of the Tantric which itself is a later development of Vedic practices. Tantric teachings abound in the use of Vedic mantras and the mysticism of the Sanskrit alphabet. They use Vedic fire altars and practices and honor Vedic deities at an inner level. Inner Tantric Yoga reflects the four main Vedic deities of Agni, Soma, Vayu and Surya (the forces of fire, moon, wind and sun).

The correlation between the Vedic and the Tantric is that whereas the Vedas emphasize the Jyotirmaya Purusha, the being

In vama marga, it is Shakti who is important, not only in sexual life but in spiritual practices, carrying out the processes of creation and in conducting most of the spiritual rituals. Amongst Hindus, all the rituals are mainly conducted by women. Woman is the commissioner; man is the participant. Whether it is an ordinary social ceremony, a religious ceremony, the worship of sonic deity or a day of fasting, it is the woman who has to introduce it. The man just has to follow her. This is the tradition in India known as initiation from the woman to the man.

Vama Marga is the spiritual path which can be practiced along with your partner. It is a sad mistake to consider the woman in tantra only as a sexual partner. Sexual life is important but it is not the only relationship that can exist between a man and woman. In tantra you don't have to fight with your religion or tradition. Tantra never said that sexual life is a sin. It says that sexual interaction is a natural urge; do it if you like. In tantra the role of initiator is shifted from the male to the female. In tantra, the woman has to be dealt with very carefully because she is the high tension line for kundalini energy.

Tantra aims at enhancing each and every aspect of human life, so to attain liberation, one must become perfect. First, one must perfect ones physical & mental faculties and then learn to control them and sublimate them and then convert and divert them to raise the soul to higher levels of spiritual progress. It enables you to perfect and control anger, hunger, thirst, hatred, ego, concentration, psychic faculties etc. It also teaches you to perfect and control sex, which is a part of our daily natural life. As one rises higher in the spiritual ladder, one gets various siddhis or powers like intuition, mind reading, healing, future gazing, mesmarising etc. At this stage, some people get carried away and forget the main goal and succumb to displaying and using these powers to gain money & fame.

In tantra, it is also to be remembered that there there is another path called dakshina marga or Vedic tantra. Here, the woman is not necessary because the aspirant is considered to have both

forces within himself. Ida is feminine and pingala masculine. Union between the mental and pranic forces is equivalent to union between a man and woman. This is the hypothesis in hatha yoga, ida is Shakti and pingala is Shiva. When they unite in ajna chakra, that is the real union. The seat of Shakti is in mooladhara. The seat of Shiva is in sahasrara, Shiva is in eternal yoga nidra there, inactive, unconcerned, nameless and formless. He has nothing to do with destruction or creation. His consciousness is homogeneous and total. There is no vibration in sahasrara. Shakti is in mooladhara and by the practices of yoga, you awaken her. She becomes aroused and makes headway through sushumna upto ajna. When Shakti reaches ajna chakra, union takes place.

This union occurs when the two poles of energy come together. When you put on switch, there is light because the wires of the switch are uniting. In the same way, in ajna chakra, when union takes place, the explosion also simultaneously occurs. Then the energy created in ajna chakra moves up to sahasrara chakra. There Shiva and Shakti unite with each other and when they unite, Shiva begins to dance. Perhaps, you have seen a photo of Nataraja. That is the symbolic expression of the awakened Shiva.

When Shiva wakes up from his profound yoga nidra, then he begins to dance. The awakening of that force in man is symbolized by the dance of Shiva in the form of Nataraja. Then, Shakti and Shiva descent together through the same path to mooladhara. Both come down together to the mundane level, the gross plane. That is the path of the saints who come down and reach us from time to time. And that is why, in kriya yoga, we have ascending and descending passages – arohan and awarohan.

Tantrik practices

If not performed properly without expert guidance, quite a few of them can have negative side effects. The repercussions of provoking and playing with the highest forces can be devastating at times. However all tantrik practices are not dangerous. There are several which are quite safe and can be practiced by the

Method of Pooja: The idol of Goddess Lakshami be of stone, silver, gold or copper etc. Sprinkle the Gangas water on the idol of Goddess Lakshami, put the tilak of kesar on the forehead. Light dhoop, gugal, white chandan, camphor etc. be mixed in ghee and make samagri and light it before idol and recite the following mantra. Early in morning take bath, wear clean clothes and sit at a pooja place. Keep all pooja articles.

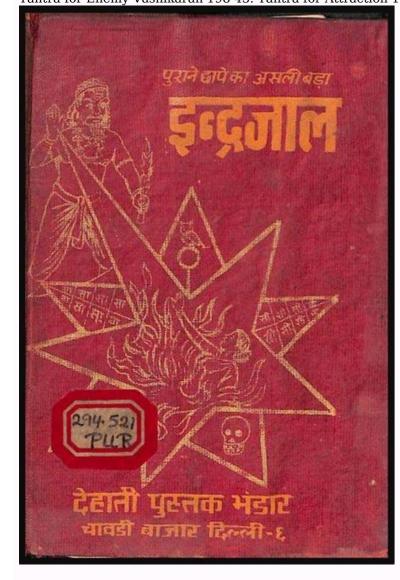
