WEEKLY MEDITATION

Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time February 15-16, 2020

What is it to sin? Presumably, we all know the answer to that question. We have all been taught the basic difference between right and wrong since early childhood and were supposed to know what sin was before receiving the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist back in

early grade school. We may even remember hearing that there was a difference between some sins being more serious or "grave" than others. Or, we may have heard of some sins being venial, mortal or even capital.

In this Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus talks about sin. Specifically He talks about this question of gravity regarding things that might be related to the Old Testament Commandments that might not seem as important as the things specifically barred by the commandments. An example He gives is murder and bullying. He says if you murder, you will be liable to judgment, but if you bully, you will be answerable to the Sanhedrin and liable to the fires of Gahanna. Jesus makes it clear that sin is sin whether it is a "big" sin or a "little" sin in the eyes of the sinner. In God's eyes it is still a sin.

Jesus points out in this reading that all sin harms our relationship with the community, with the person(s) we have sinned against, and with God. He points out one more important thing to us in this gospel reading. It is about reconciliation. The sign of peace which we exchange with our neighbors during the Mass is a sign of our heartfelt desire to be reconciled with our brothers and sisters whom we have harmed by our own sinfulness. Because of that heartfelt desire and because we recognize that, when we sin, we harm the community, we say to our neighbors who stand in for those we have harmed, "The peace of the Lord be with you." However, we are also reminded that we need to be reconciled before approaching the altar and this means learning to say unqualified and unequivocally, "I am sorry," to make amends, and to repair relationships. It also means that not every time, but more often than most of us do, when we go into church, we need to make a left hand turn at the first door at the back of the church and stop and see the man in black who acts for God and talk to him about our sins and hear him say, "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."


