WEEKLY MEDITATION

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 23-24, 2019

What an exciting time of year! As a friend of mine says, "It is the High Holy days; the Triduum of Chocolate: Halloween, Thanksgiving, and Christmas!" If you look in the shops, the mailboxes, the catalogues, the periodicals and the pop-up ads on your phone or on your computer, you can't help to miss that we have entered into this sacred season. I am almost so accustomed to it by now that I do not even notice it any more. I used to react to it with Christian indignation decrying how secularism was chipping away at the sacred as holiday wares went on sale earlier and earlier. Now I hardly notice as the mad rush toward Christmas begins to take up steam somewhere in June.

But, this Sunday we have our own celebration. It is a great one! It is a solemnity! The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This past year, we have celebrated Jesus' conception, his birth, his life of ministry, his teaching, his suffering, his death, his resurrection, his ascension, his sending of the Holy Spirit, his gift of the Church, and now his everlasting guidance for that Church.

Today, it is not sufficient for us to try to puzzle out what the regal images that we have received from the middle ages of Jesus seated on a thrown wearing a crown might mean for us today in an age where we do not identify with small fiefdoms ruled by kings and lords. That age is gone. Today, we must ask ourselves the real question at the heart of that Image of Jesus as King. For, if he is King, he rules not only the universe, not only the Church, not only my heart, but my will.

Today, do I turn my whole heart and my whole will over to Jesus?


ST. MICHAEL'S CHRISTMAS TREE & WREATH SALES
