Theology: First Year Courses

THEO-101 Faith: The Christian Foundation

This course on faith will provide an explanation of what it means to have faith in God and in the Word of God. The students will learn how to scripturally develop their faith.

THEO-102 Pneumatology/ Holy Spirit and Gifts

This course will help students to learn about the Holy Spirit and His relationship to the believer. It will also teach students about the different kinds of spiritual gifts, their purposes and their functions in both the lives of individual believers and the church body as a whole.

THEO-103 Principles of Prayer

This course will provide an understanding of the purposes and principles of the various types of prayer, as well as how they function in our daily lives. The course will show people how to pray and seek God on a daily basis.

THEO-104 Divine Health and Healing

THEO-105 Biblical Finances

THEO-106 Introduction to the Bible

MP-100 Ministry Practicum

Theology: Second Year Courses

THEO-201 Old Testament Survey

THEO-203 Divine Guidance/ The Anointing

Students will define and describe the anointing. They will understand the purpose of the anointing in the believer's life. Students will learn how to operate in the anointing.

True righteousness is often misunderstood. This course delves into the Word of God to reveal to the student what righteousness means and how it is attained.
