Page 415 Andrew Hynes of County of Nelson, State of Kentucky.
Will dated 21 July 1800

All my just debts to be speedily paid which are but few except those which I owe in copartnership with William R. Hynes, which are to be paid out of the money arising from the profits of the store in which they originated and that as soon as the money can possibly be collected.

To dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Hynes all my personable (sic) and moveable property (to wit) slaves, stock of all kinds and description, bonds, notes, book accounts, debts, goods and chattle of every description that can or may be considered as personal estate and moveable property.

Also so much of my real estate as hereafter mentioned (to wit) the Plantation on which I now live, also my plantation lying at the Junction of the Beech and Rolling Fork of Salt River. Also one acre of land lying in Hardin County on the south side of the Rolling Fork and opposite the last mentioned plantation. Also a plantation I own lying in Soverns (sic) Valley, Hardin County. Also my house and lot in Bardstown the whole of the before mentioned property (except the plantation at the Junction of the Beech and Rowling fork, the acre of land on the south side of the Rowling Fork opposite the said Plantation, my house and lot in Bardstown) to continue in my wife Elizabeth Hynes' possession for the support of my family and education of my children so long as she continues my widow. But in case she should alter hersituation by marriage then and in that case she is to have what the Law allows. The property above excepted also to continue in her possession as above until my son Abner Hynes is 21 years of age, then to descend to my son Abner with other property as is hereafter directed.

Also all the lots in Elizabethtown, Hardin County, which were purchased for my benefit but not yeat conveyed shall be sold and the money arising from the sale of said lots to be applied as before directed to the education of my children and support of my family.

To son Thomas Hynes and daughter Nancy Hynes jointly all the lands I am possessed of in Soverns Valley, Hardin County, which lands contain about six hundred acres, be the same more or less, to be equally divided by two disinterested persons chosen by themselves, provided they can not agree on the division themselves.

To son Abner Hynes the Plantation I own at the mouth of the Beech and Rowling Fork containing 400 acres and known by the name of Kenneday's Station. Also one acre of land with appurtances thereto belonging lying on the south side of Beech Fork and now in possession of Luke Calvin. (Continued on page 18.)

At a Court held for Hardin County on Tuesday the 24th day of January 1797 Present Stephen Rawlings George Helm James McMahan and Thomas McIntire Gent Justices

On the Motion of Benjamin Tolbott Baptist Minister who produced credentials of his Ordination and together with Robert Barnet his Security Entered into and acknowledge their bond and took the oath to this Commonwealth Licence is granted him to solemnise the rights of Matrimony agreeably to the rules of his Church

The Emancipation of Davies(?) a negro man the property of James Brown was acknowledged by the said party and was ordered to be recorded

William Bushes Earmark is as follows a Crop in the right ear and an underbit in left

A deed from Gabriel Madison to Robert Mosly for a number of Lotts in the Town of Hartford was acknowledged by Harrison Taylor attorney in fact for said Madison and was ordered to be recorded

Same from the same to John Smith
Same from the same to Robert Allen For lotts in said Town
Same from the same to Elinor Morgan of Hartford
Same from the same to William Sharp
were acknowledged by the said Harrison Taylor attorney in fact for said Madison and were ordered to be recorded

Present Robert Hodgins Gent Justice

A deed from Robert Baird to Harrison Taylor for 12 acres of Land was acknowledged by the said Robert and was ordered to be recorded

Mr. William Polk Gent produced a nomination from Charles Helm Gent Surveyor appointing him his Deputy he having been previously examined took the Oath of a Surveyor

The persons appointed to view a Road from the Courthouse to Jacob Vanmatre's Mill made their report in the following words (to wit) Beginning at the Courthouse runing thence with the Green river Road to a Beechtree standing about 15 poles the upper side of Jacob Vanmatre's fence Thence Crofsing the Valley Creek and nearly the Course of the Old Road to the top of the ridge this side of Daniel Linders Thence Crofsing rudes Creek about one hundred and forty yards above said Linders house Thence nearly with the old road to the said Mill

Ordered that the said Road so laid off be Established and Christopher Bush be appointed overseer of said Road and that all the tithables on the waters of the Valley Creek from Mr. Haycrafts plantation down including Jacob Vanmatre plantation do afsist him in Clearing and keeping said road in repair

On the Motion of James Nourse in order to have a ferry established acrofs the Rolling at his Land above and near the mouth of knob Creek agreeably to a late Law the Court being unacquainted with said Law are willing to advise thereupon till next Court

On the Motion of Caleb Hazle who together with Charles Lee his security entered into and acknowledged their bond conditioned as the law directs Licence is granted him for keeping an ordinary at his house on knob Creek for the Term of one year next ensuing this date and from then till the next Court to be held for said County

On the Motion of Samuel Haycraft Gent Sheriff Elijah Beavens was admitted his Deputy and thereupon took the Oath required by Law

On the motion of Robert Hodgin who together with James Nourse his security entered into and acknowledged their bond as the Law directs Licence is granted him for keeping a tavern at his house for the term of one year next ensuing this date and from then till the next Court to be held for said County

Ordered that Jacob Rhoades William Bush Jonas Gray and Thomas Miller or any three of them being first sworn do view the most convenient way for a Road from the Courthouse to a in the Rolling fork near Frakes's and make report thereof to the next Court

A deed from Syllas Tolbett to Robert Johnson was produced in Court duly authenticated and was ordered to be recorded.

The Commonwealth plaintiff against John Ormsby Defendant on hearing the Defendant and his Witnefses it is considered by the Court that he be dismissed out of Custody

Ordered that Caleb Hazle Daniel Vittertow and William Hanks being first sworn do view the ground from Caleb Hazles to James Nourses at the mouth of knob Creek and report to the next Court whether an alteration in said Road would be beneficial or not

John Thomas Gent produced a Commifsion appointing him Colonel of the third Rigiment which was openly Read in Court and then took the Oath required by the Constitution and the Oath of Office.

George Helm Gent produced a Commifsion under the hand and seal of his Excellency James Garrard Governor appointing him paymaster to the said third Regiment and took the oath of office

Thomas McIntire Gent produced a nomination from Charles Helm Gent Surveyor appointing him his Deputy he having been previously Examined took the oath of a Surveyor

Ordered that Joseph Money(?) be appointed Constable

Ordered that Court be adjourned till Court in Course

ELIZABETHTOWN CITY COUNCIL MINUTES 1812, 1813, 1814

On Saturday the 11th day of January 1812 the Board met according to adjournment Present Benjamin Helm Saml Stevenson & Jackson Hedges Gentlemen

On motion made and seconded it is considered by Said board that all Showes and Exhibitions in Said Town should pay Something as a Contribution for the benefit of Said Town, it is therefore agreed that Lewis Johnson & C who is about to exhibit the wax figures in Said town do pay to Horatio Waide the sum of five dollars for the benefit of Said town whereupon he the said Lewis & Co paid to the clerk of this board the said sum of five dollars Ben Helm Prt.

Ordered that the board adjourn

At a meeting of the board of Trustees at the house of Daniel Waide on Saturday the 30th day of July 1814 Present William D Stone Jackson Hedges & Benjamin Helm Gentl.

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that Horatio Waide former clerk of this board has departed this life--Whereupon Jackson Hedges was duly appointed clerk to this board in place of the said Horatio Waide Deceased and took the necessary oath of office

Ordered that the board be adjourned

Also 50 acres of land which I purchased for Adam Shepherd. Also 43 acres of land adjoining the lands of Jonas Gray. Also my house and lot in Bardstown which I purchase from Austin Hubbard. Also the equal share of one thousand nine hundred and fifty acres of land lying in Hardin County on Salt River and patented in the name of And^r Thomas and Abner Hynes as joint tenants in common. Also 24 acres of land adjoining the lands on which Bardstown is situated and conveyed by Walter Beall Senr. to him the said Abner Hynes.

To son Alfred Warford Hynes the Plantation on which I live containing 450 acres.

To son Thomas Hynes one equal half of 1950 acres of land lying in Hardin County on Salt River and patented in the names of Andrew Thomas and Abner Hynes. Also 200 acres of land lying in Jefferson County to be conveyed by Abraham Hite.

To daughter Polly 500 acres of land lying in Hardin County being one equal half of Denton's preemption. Also 200 acres adjoining the above preemption.

To my five children hereafter named (to wit) Sarah Churchwell(?) Elizabeth Harrison, Thomas Hynes, Nancy Churchwell(?), and Abner Hynes, each an equal part of 7800 acres of land, it being an unappropriated part of a survey of 8900 acres lying in the big bend of Green River and patented in the name of Philip Philips.

To daughters Nancy Hynes and Polly Hynes each one hundred pounds cash to be raised out of lands that are in the hands of my executors, the money to be paid to them as soon as they enter into the state of matrimony.

Being desirous that the Salem Academy should be encouraged and the present building for that purpose completed, I bequeath to the trustees of said Academy 500 acres of land lying in Hardin County on the waters of Clifty and being the one half of one thousand acres surveyed in the name of Hynes and Ferry (Terry?), on the following conditions (to wit) that provided the trustees of said Academy cause the walls of the present building to be completely raised and covered within twelve months from this date, that then the above land be appropriated by the said trustees towards the finishing the inside work in such way as shall be deemed most beneficial and advantageous, and it is my intentions to give my right title of interest only and that neither me nor my heirs to be accountable or liable to make good the land or any tract thereof in case it should be taken or lost by any prior or better claim-otherwise children get it.

All lands not heretofore divided to remain in hands of executors for payment of debts and fulfillment of all contracts, and if necessary to be sold by executors for education of children and support of family, and after the death of my wife Elizabeth Hynes all lands that are not disposed of by my executors to be equally divided between my seven children Sarah Churchell, Elizabeth Harrison, Thomas Hynes, Nancy Hynes, Polly Hynes, Abner Hynes, and Alfred Warford Hynes.

I emancipate and set free ny few Negroes in the following manner one Negro boy named Bob which is now about 14 years of age to be free at the age of 30 years; also one other Negro boy named George

about the age of 7 years old to be free at the age of 30 years; also one other Negro boy named Rubin about 7 years of age to be free at 30 years of age; also one Negro girl four years of age to be free at the age of 25 years old and her offspring (if any) to be free at the age of 25 years old forever; also one Negro woman named Beck to be free at the death of my mother Hannah Barns.

Nephew William R. Hynes, Michael Campbell, and my son Thomas Hynes (when he shall arrive at the age of twenty-one years old) my sole executors jointly or separately.
