RULES

1. Tournament is rain or shine and is a **live release format**
2. Lines in the water no earlier than 6 AM
3. All fish must be caught on hook and line and must be legal per DNR regulations
4. **Fishing will only be permitted inside Murrells Inlet and within 200 yards of the jetties.**
5. **No pier, dock (weigh station dock) or land fishing**
6. Angler must weigh their live fish in at Marlin Quay and must be released after weigh-in
7. Anglers may keep any legal-size flounder they choose not to weigh-in
8. No changing of boats or transfer of items between boats during tournament fishing.
9. Each Angler will receive a weigh-in slip in their Captain's package
10. In the event of a tie, the longest total length of the tied fish will determine the tie-break, and the Rules Committee will resolve any further tie.

11. Any Tampering of fish weight will result in disqualification **(and/Or will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.)**

12. All entries will fish at their own risk. FSOS assumes no responsibilities or liability for any Captain's decisions or for any boat in this tournament.

13. Entry fee Adult \$60.00

14. Entry fee Youth under 18 YOA 20.00

15. All Tournament Committee members decision are final.

THE HISTORY OF:

The Shillelagh Club was founded in February of 1964 by a group of men in Old Bridge, New Jersey who petitioned Jackie Gleason for the use of the name and he graciously agreed. Over the years FSOS has grown to 4 locations: Old Bridge, Essex County, Jersey Shore and Ocean County.

While the migration of Northerners to South Carolina took place, a small group of Irish Americans joined together and petitioned the "Father Club" for a charter here in South Carolina. The "Father Club" in Old Bridge granted a charter to our organization in June of 2022 becoming the 5th location here in Murrells Inlet, South Carolina.

Our inaugural meeting was held on July 23, 2022, at Southside Patty's Bar and Grill consisting of 39 charter members. An executive board was established and our first fundraiser, 1/2 Way to St. Patrick's Day Party was scheduled on September 17, 2022, at the Beave Bar located in Murrells Inlet, SC. A few members established a relationship with members of the VFW, and shortly thereafter, the club was able to secure the Murrells Inlet VFW post #10420 for their Monthly meetings and social gatherings.

The club, which is a non-profit Organization, is proud to donate to many local organizations including Southern Grand Strand Food Bank (Helping Hands), The Village Group in Plantersville, SC as well as local charitable events. The club also holds a yearly Toy Drive for the Village Group in Plantersville, SC which the club collects toys and raises monies for the smallest Elementary school in South Carolina. The Club has also created a building fund campaign to purchase property in the Murrells Inlet Area to establish our own Clubhouse. Our club is now approaching 100 members within the first six months. Collectively the FSOS has donated well over 1 million dollars to charities and those less fortunate in their communities.
