

## **158th Field Artillery Awards Register**

The "Book of Merit" is an official publication of the 158th Field Artillery Association. It contains information and announcements to the general public that promulgate organizational accomplishments and unit history. It is published quarterly on the World Wide Web (WWW) at the following address:

and is compiled by active and retired veterans of the 158th Field Artillery. There are copyright restrictions if it is used in the public domain.

The registry is a computer database that collects submitted information from the veteran, published in a facsimile, used to promulgate morale and "esprit de corps". The registry collects electronic information from the large numbers of veterans whom have served in the organization. It is placed into a secure data base that protects the privacy by adhering to security protocols of a strict set of privacy rules.

Information is submitted electronically to the "Awards Register" via e-mail at the following address: [onefiveeightregiment@yahoo.com](mailto:onefiveeightregiment@yahoo.com) where it is collected, assessed, assembled, and then published into a standard facsimile. The submissions are electronic files of individual awards, normally official certificates and/or official orders. This data is stored on a "non-shared network" as raw database, until it is validated and then assembled into a facsimile for promulgation to the general public. Certain portions of the raw database are used only in the assessment and validation process and not for public domain release. The register uses Invisible Digital Signatures and Credentials Technology (IDSACT) thus guaranteeing the authenticity of the facsimile and once applied cannot

be edited without removing the digital signature. Each quarterly issue is divided into three categories of Decorations, Medals and Badges. The Badge Certificate Facsimile is the only IDSACT certification returned to the submitter (upon request) in Portable Document Format (PDF) ISO32000 for tile scale printing. The chain of custody for raw database usage is submitter to registry rule, with no third party transactions. In the event of third party submissions, then the chain of custody rule still applies.
