Zilber Hall Student Services Building at Marquette University provides a welcoming new “front door” and student-focused operational hub for this prominent Midwestern campus. This facility brings together under one roof a diverse group of programs and departments currently scattered across campus, offering a more centralized “one-stop shop” for virtually all student administrative.

Located on a busy traffic thoroughfare at the heart of both the campus and downtown Milwaukee, Zilber Hall helps create a new public face for the campus while paying respect to the adjacent iconic and historic Marquette Hall and Gesu Parish.

Zilber Hall is a four-story steel frame building with an attached pre-fabricated brick and concrete panel system. Other project highlights for this LEED® certified building include a variety of passive solar and daylighting strategies to minimize energy use and increase occupant comfort.

The building design engages the streetscape and creates positive outdoor spaces that support pedestrian activity. Five species of native trees not previously found on campus were planted around the building as part of the campus mission for landscape sustainability.
