Marquette Hall • Milwaukee, Wisconsin



A campus landmark at Marquette University, Marquette Hall features a Gothic bell tower that houses the university carillon which fills campus with music every Wednesday afternoon. The four-story building is home to several offices, including the Departments of English and Theology and the Educational Opportunity Program. Classes are held in three large lecture halls. Finished in 1924, Marquette Hall was originally known as the Science Building. The university renamed the academic hall in 1967 to honor its namesake, lesuit missionary-explorer Father Jacques Marquette, S.J.

Marquette Hall renovations increased the space for the English, theology and philosophy departments, giving them one shared main office space on the first floor, with faculty offices located on the second, third and fourth floors. Restorations to the first three floors included revamping three large lecture halls and the renovation of the fourth floor.
